Mrs. Alma Elsie Morgan, 85, a lifetime resident of Heppner, died Dec. 14 at Pioneer Memorial Hospital. She was born here, Oct. 19, 1889.

She was the daughter of Thomas Marlatt and Melissa Hart, both pioneer Morrow County residents. Mrs. Morgan was a member of the Heppner Christian Church, where memorial services were held Tuesday morning with the Rev. G. E. Nikander officiating.

She was buried in the Masonic Cemetery with Sweeney Mortuary in charge of arrangements.

Mrs. Morgan's husband, Levi Morgan, preceded her in death in 1946. Her survivors include three daughters, Harriet Evans and Ellen Campbell, Heppner, and Juanita Sprouls, Condon; a son, Marvin Morgan, Yakima; a brother, Tom Marlatt, Heppner; 17 grandchildren; 41 great-grandchildren and numerous nieces and nephews.

The Committee for Women's Activity of the Willows Grange will meet Saturday, Dec. 21, 2 p.m., at the Grange Hall.

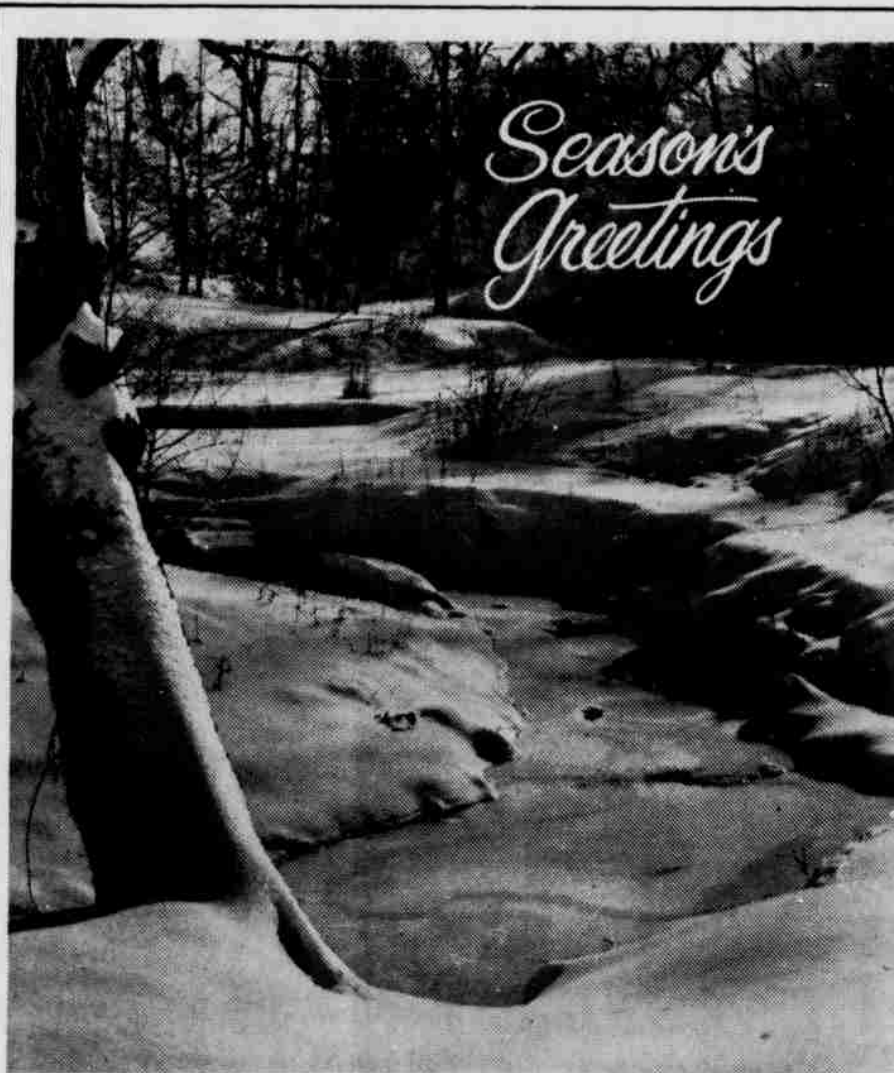

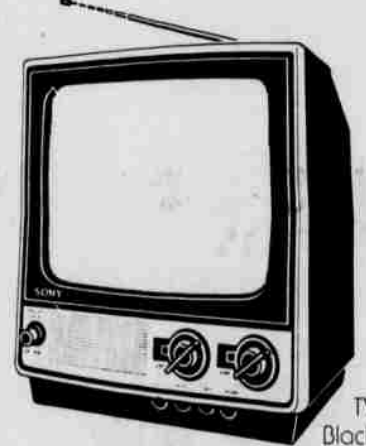
