YCC recruiting program starts

Recruiting for the 1975 Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) will begin shortly after the first of the year, State Recruiter Tom Sullivan said today in Salem.

Application forms for YCC will be in the hands of high school officials and in local state employment offices. All young people between the ages of 15 and 18 years are eligible.

The federally funded program will employ about 250 youth in conservation projects on state and federal lands in Oregon, Sullivan said. Environmental education will be a part of the program as well.

Out of school youth, youth from low income families, and youth who are members of ethnic minorities are especially urged to apply.

Selection of participants will be made by a random choice with each applicant having an equal opportunity of being selected.

Time for aliens to report

The Immigration and Naturalization Service has announced that the annual alien address report program is again under way.

Approximately 26,000 aliens reported their addresses last year in the State of Oregon. The number is expected to be slightly larger this year.

The immigration official pointed out that the address reports are required by law and willful failure to comply with these requirements may lead to serious consequences.

Forms with which to make the reports are available at all post offices and immigration and naturalization service offices.
