No public comments were received at a March 19 public hearing on Blue Mountain Community College's 1975-76 operating budget.

Election is scheduled May 6 in Umatilla and Morrow counties. BMCC has no tax base, requiring annual elections to provide funds to run the college.

The budget, approved last month by the budget committee, will require a levy of \$1,465,594 to operate the college for the next school year. The rate is expected to be between \$1.85 and \$1.95 per \$1,000 true cash value, depending on the total Umatilla-Morrow county evaluation.

The exact true cash value of the two-county district won't be known for several months. The cost per taxpayer for a \$20,000 home would run between \$37 and \$39.

In other business the board was told that Brent Horn will retire from the board in July. Horn, the senior member of the board in length of service said he is stepping down to make room for new blood.

Two candidates have filed for Horn's position, Pat Dye, Pendleton, and John Hansell, Hermiston. Deadline for filing for the position is April 1. Persons interested in running for the post may contact College President Ron Daniels for information.
