### Wildlife areas closed to dog training

Hunting dog owners are reminded that it is illegal to run or train dogs on land or water that is productive wildlife nesting habitat during the four-month period which begins April 1 and extends through July. The regulation is designed to protect nesting wildlife and its young during this vulnerable period and is in no way intended to discourage the use of trained dogs during the hunting seasons. The role hunting dogs play in preventing needless crippling loss of game birds and waterfowl is well recognized, as well as the pleasurable dimension the companionship of a trained dog adds to a hunting trip. Dog training and competitive field trials are encouraged at other times of the year and are accommodated on many of the Commission's wildlife management areas. During the April through July period, dogs may be trained at any time in non-productive habitat.

Heppner's Mustang boys track team finished second in their way meet last Saturday. The Dallas facing still was the team from a larger Washington school, Golden-Ark, Wa. won the event with 183 points. Heppner 37, Wabtonka 30 and Dufur 9. There were several outstanding performances as the Mustangs earned five first-place finishes, four second places, three thirds and two fourths. Dave McLeod was high score performer with 17½ seconds coming from first in the 400 yard and low hurdles, was on the winning mile relay team and placed second in the 4x400 hurdles. He jumped 6'6" and placed in a career best of 21.2 in the long. Other bests were earned by Wade Padberg with a 52.2 in the 100 and Don Marshall who threw the discus 117'9". Other members of the mile relay team were Ray Cate, Steve McLaughlin and Padberg with a time of 3:46.3. Also placing second were Tom Wolf in the 800, 2:11, Carl Christian pole vault, 10'7", and Randy Devine, 10'0". Third places went to Wolf in the mile, 5:11.2, Marshall, shot put, 36'11", and the 400 relay team of Cate, McLaughlin, Christian and Padberg. Cate was fourth in the 700 with a time of 2:49 and McLaughlin was fourth in the 400 hurdles with 2:03. The Saturday Mustangs will be competing in the Goshute Invitational beginning at 10:00 a.m. The following Tuesday Heppner hosts Sherman, Dufur, Ione, Wasco County, Condon and Wabtonka with field events starting at 4:00 p.m.
