## Bank business shows increase

First National Bank of Oregon reported increases in loans, deposits and earnings for the first quarter of 1975, according to Robert F. Wallace, president of the state-wide financial institution.

Deposits were \$2,124,027,000 on March 31, compared with \$2,103,916,000 posted at the end of the first quarter of 1974.

Loans at First National's 140 statewide offices moved up to \$1,381,611,000, a gain of 1.2 per cent from the \$1,364,955,000 listed on the same date in 1974. Total resources were \$2,622,150,000, up from \$2,622,850,000, on March 31, last year.

Income before securities transactions for the first quarter amounted to \$5,277,000 or 98 cents per share, up 9.1 per cent from \$4,789,000, or 90 cents per share recorded during the first quarter of 1974. Net income, after securities transactions, was \$5,249,000. This compares to \$4,804,000 last year.

The Heppner branch reported deposits of \$9,975,963 and loans of \$10,966,730 as of March 31. Comparable totals for the branch a year ago were \$9,013,532 in deposits and \$8,707,909 in loans.

Said levy shall be placed upon the 1975-76 assessment rolls and the taxes will be due and payable on November 15, 1975, February 15, 1976, May 15, 1976 and August 15, 1976. The reasons for establishing this tax levy are for the payment of employees salaries, supplies and equipment for the operation and maintenance of the cemeteries within the Cemetery District, all as required by the laws of the State of Oregon.

At this time there will be an election of one Director of the District pursuant to ORS 263.116, said Director will take office July 1, 1975, and serve for a term of three years.

The votes will be by ballot upon which will be marked "Tax Levy" and "No Tax Levy" and the voter shall cross the parenthesis with an X in it between the "Tax Levy" and the word "Yes" or between the word "No Tax Levy" and the word "No" whichever indicates his choice. All voters will vote at Ione City Hall, Ione, Oregon, or Lexington City Hall, Lexington, Oregon.

## Court house notes

The budget hearings involving the various departments of the county began last Tuesday. However, that was only the beginning, and turned out to be the only day last week that saw budget hearings. The assessor's office has been busy sending out notices of change in assessed valuation to property owners. The

notices comply with ORS 306.280. The notice is sent to advise you of the assessed value that has been placed on the property described hereon for use on the next assessment roll now being prepared. The preceding year's values are also shown.

County Planner David Moon explained that closure of the existing dump at Heppner depends on several factors. A most significant factor being that a new site must be opened. He estimates that the site planned could be ready around July 1 and that arrangements to close the Heppner dump would follow. The Solid Waste Advisory Board is presently considering plans for the dump.

## Brand law changes effective May 11

Brand inspection regulations have been amended in three areas by the Oregon Department of Agriculture effective May 11.

The areas are: Cattle sold for or valued at \$10 or less will be exempt from the change of ownership brand inspection requirement.

The time limit for filing of brand inspection exemption certificates will be extended from the present 72 hours to eight days.

The time when custom slaughtering or processing establishments are required to submit slaughtering certificates is changed from the present 30 days from slaughter to the time the animal hide is brand inspected.
