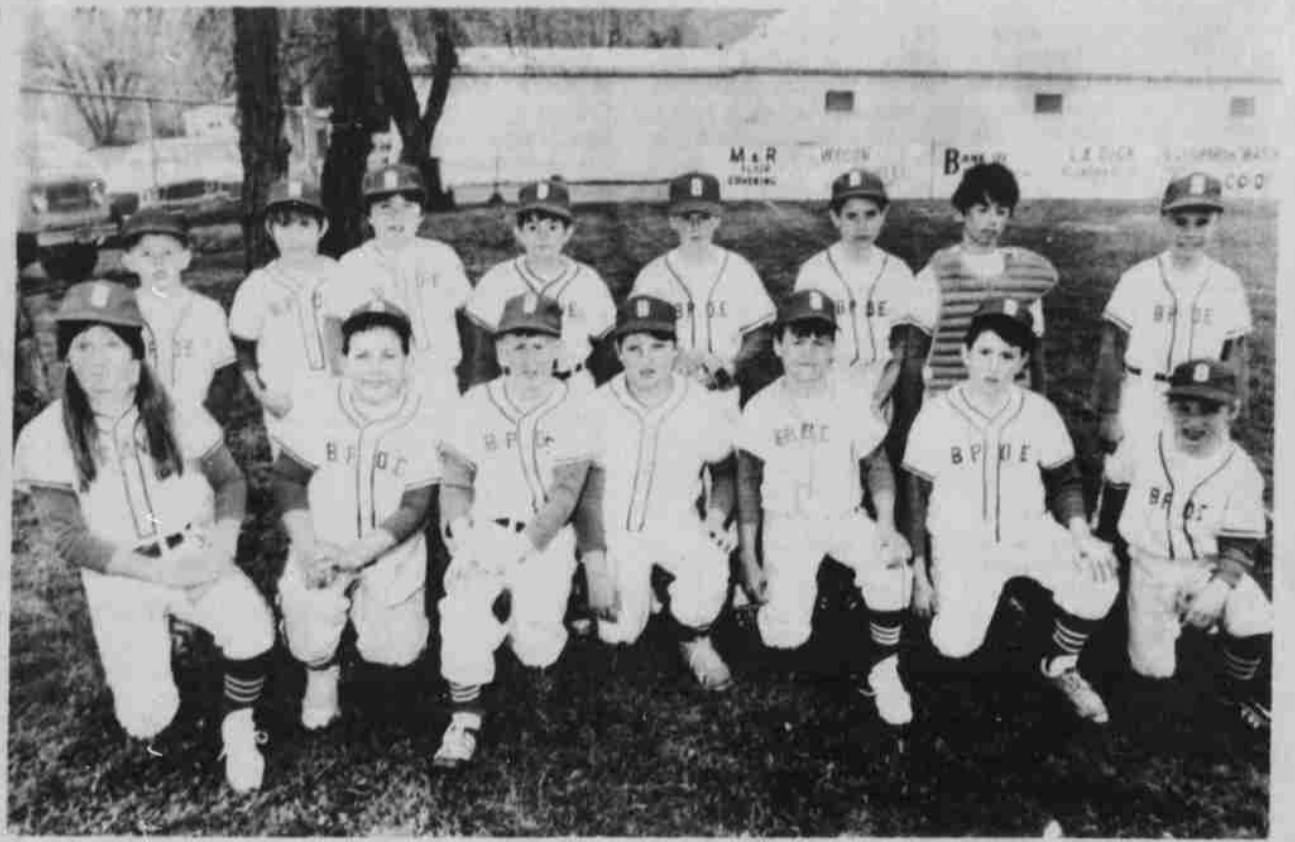

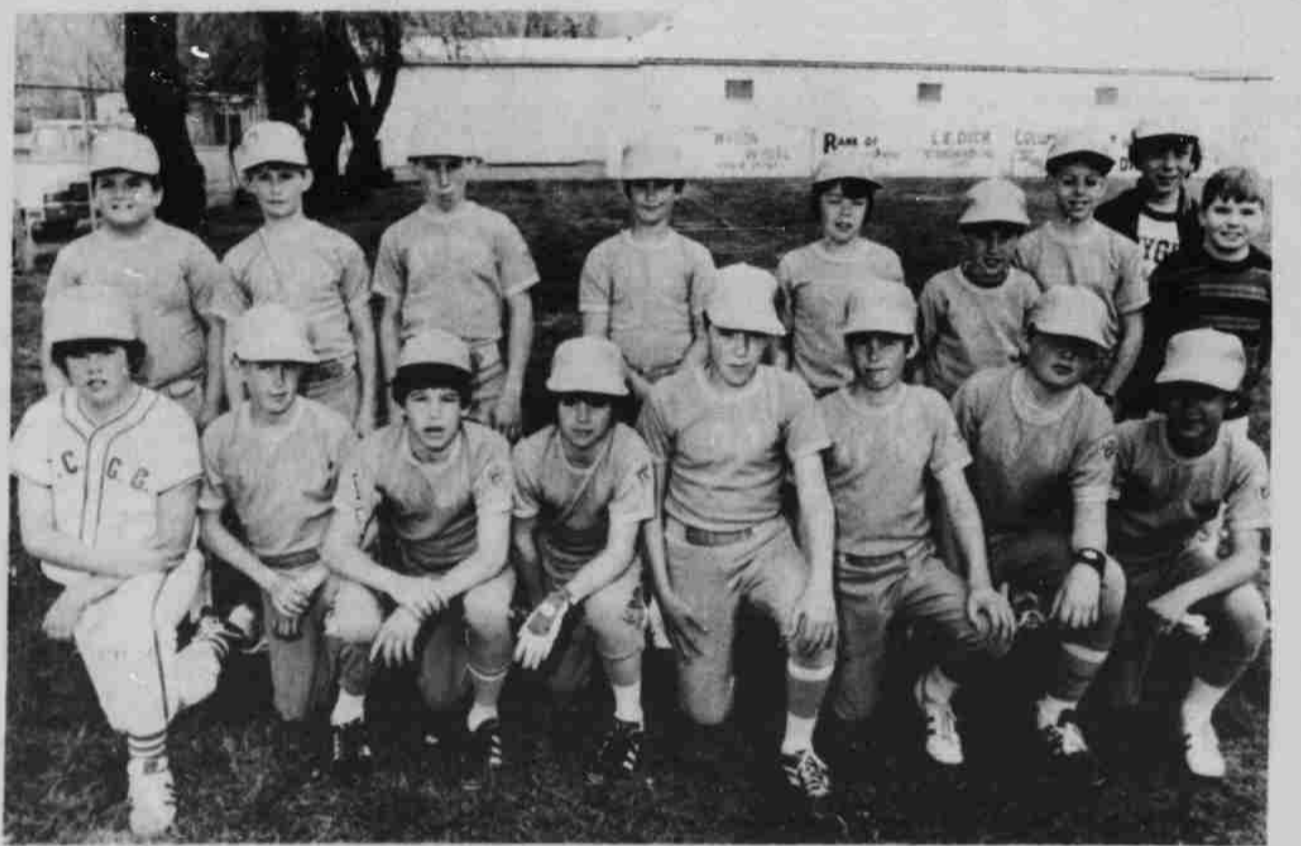

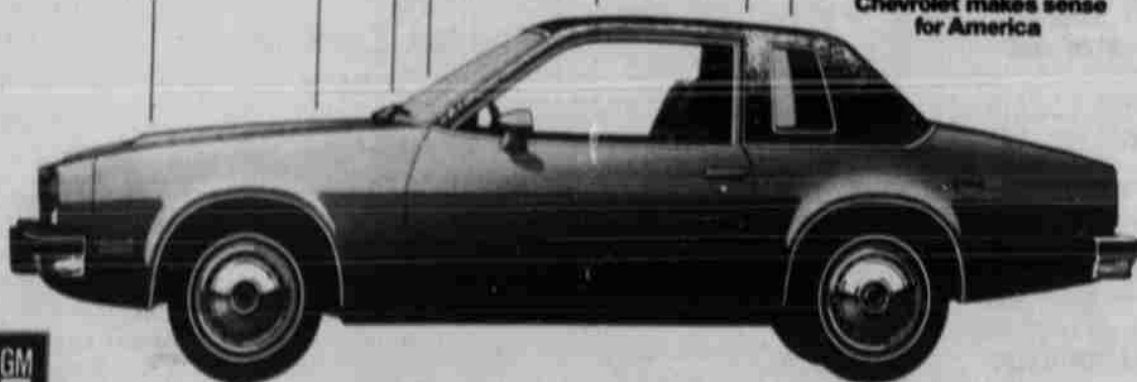

District 7-A meet Saturday

The 1975 District 7-A track and field meet is scheduled for Saturday at Condon with defending champion Heppner favored to bring home the team title again.

The district meet is the culminating event for the current spring season. First and second place winners and those earning qualifying standards earn a trip to the state class A to be held at Pleasant Hill the following weekend, May 15-16.

Saturday's event is scheduled to get underway with preliminaries in the field events at 10:30 a.m. with finals at 11:00. Running preliminaries begin at 11:30 with the finals slated for 1:30 p.m.

Schools participating include Heppner, Ione, Riverside, Helix, Umapine, Pilot Rock, Echo, Condon, Umatilla, Wasco County, Weston-McEwen and Sherman County.

Mustangs second in 4-way meet

Heppner trackmen finished second in a four-way meet in Pendleton Monday afternoon. Final team scores were Pendleton 127½, Heppner 71, Weston-McEwen 38½, Pilot Rock 25. The Pendleton squad was made up of varsity and junior varsity members excluding seniors.

The Mustangs compiled seven first place victories. Pendleton had six and Weston-McEwen and Pilot Rock two each.

High point performer and the only double victor for Heppner was David McLeod with first in the high hurdles and 220. He was third in the high jump and a member of the winning mile relay team.

Clayton Wilson scored 13 with a first in the 100, a fourth in the javelin. Dewayne McClain added 10 with a first in the mile and second in the 800.

McClain's time in the mile was a "best", 4:47.2, and his 800 time of 2:09.5 is second best in the district.

Second place efforts were recorded by Wade Padberg in the 440.

Dan Marshall won the discus and second place efforts were recorded by Wade Padberg, 440, and Carl Christman, pole vault. Thirds went to Tom Wolff, 440 and Steve McLaughlin, low hurdles. Dave Allstott was fourth in the high jump.
