Any unbranded cattle or any cattle bearing brands of previously unauthorized cattle which are found to be making continuing or subsequent unauthorized use within twelve months after publication of this notice may be impounded without further notice. After the impoundment, owners of unauthorized cattle may regain possession thereof only by first showing proof of ownership and reimbursing the United States in full for the expense incurred in impounding, feeding and care of such cattle. All impounded animals not redeemed within 5 days after impoundment will be offered for sale at public auction. Animals not sold at public sale may be sold at private sale or condemned and destroyed, or otherwise disposed of as provided by Regulation 36 C.F.R. 261.13.

## TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS INCREASE

Traffic violation convictions reported to the Motor Vehicles Division during the first four months of 1975 showed a 25 per cent increase over the same period last year.

The 164,006 convictions recorded compared with 130,623 convictions during the same period in 1974.

Through April there were 23,227 driver license suspensions, an increase of 6 1/2 per cent over last year at that time. All but 2,573 of the suspensions were issued under mandatory requirements of the law.

The report also noted that 149 driver licenses were revoked during the first four months of this year. Most of the revocations, 107, were based on the habitual traffic offender law which requires a 10-year revocation if a court determines a driver is a habitual offender.
