County budget shows increase

The budget for Morrow County for fiscal year 1975-76 has been prepared and is available for inspection at the county courthouse.

The budget is up \$13,571 from last year's budget and voters will have to vote on a total of \$201,573 to approve a serial levy. A serial levy of \$54,573 will be needed by Pioneer Memorial Hospital to balance their budget with the remaining \$147,000 needed by the county road department.

A hearing on the budget will be held June 24, at 9 a.m. at the County Judge's Office, so interested persons may appear and discuss the proposed budget.
