Edmundson hired as assistant superintendent

The Morrow County School Board hired John Edmundson as the new assistant to the county school superintendent at its Monday evening meeting at the district office in Lexington. Edmundson has been the principal of the Ione school for the past three years.

The position of curriculum coordinator was vacated last July when Ernie Teale left the position. At that time the board decided to change the position to assistant to the superintendent rather than curriculum coordinator. Edmundson will assume sec-

dary curriculum programs along with other responsibilities. Superintendent Doherty will be responsible for elementary curriculum programs.

Prior to coming to Ione, Edmundson had taught for eight years in the Salem school system followed by two years in the central office. During that time he also did graduate work at Boston College and the University of Oregon. Edmundson went to high school in Hood River and graduated from college at Willamette University in Salem.

Edmundson's wife Pat, teaches first grade at Heppner Elementary School. They have three children, Vicki, a junior, Christie, a sophomore and Jeff an eighth grader. The Edmundson family has been quite active in community affairs since moving to Ione.

Edmundson stated he will remain in the Ione position until a replacement is found. He anticipates taking over his new duties sometime in mid-August.

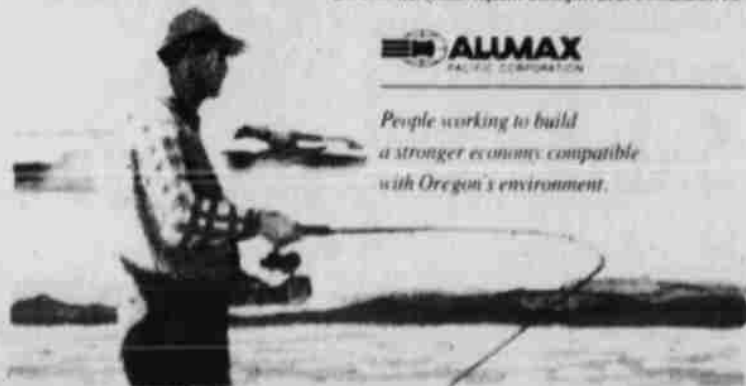

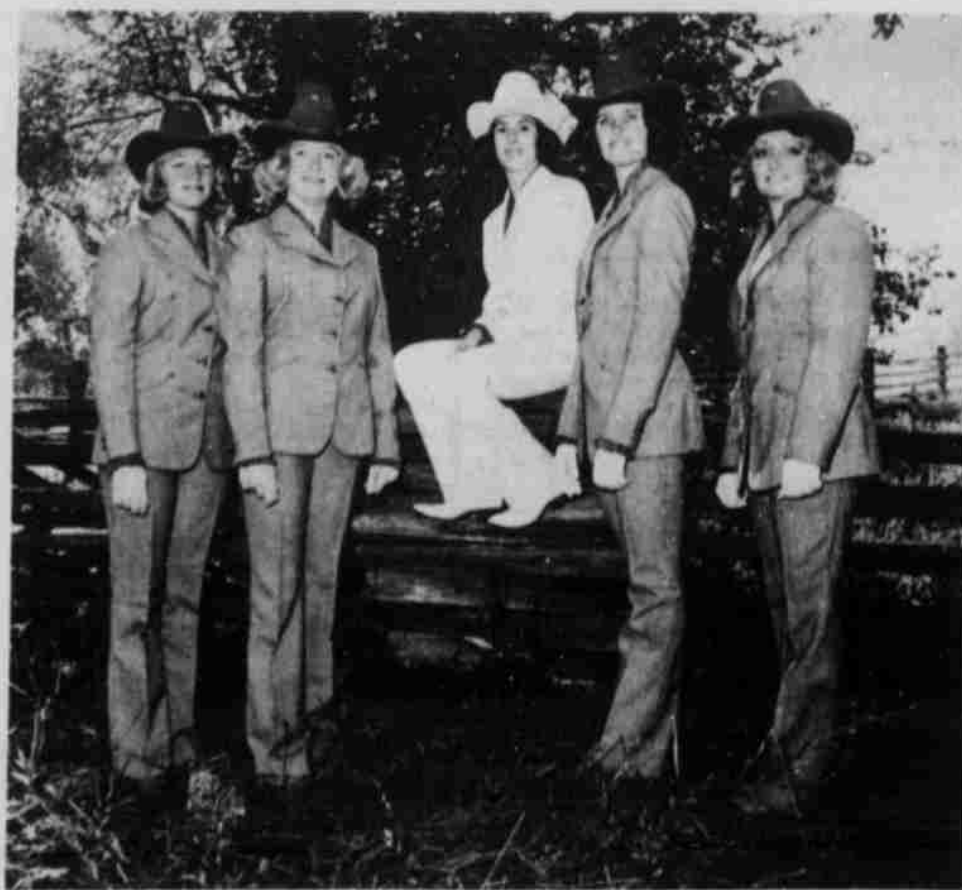
