Food drying clinic scheduled

Increased interest in drying of fruits and vegetables in this area has caused the Extension Service to plan a series of evening workshops on the subject, according to Birdine Tullis, Morrow Extension Assistant.

The Heppner workshop will be held on July 16, 7:30 at the fairgrounds. Many employed homemakers interested in drying of foods were unable to attend the recent daytime meetings.

Molly Saul, extension home economist will demonstrate and explain techniques of drying in dehydrator, oven and sun. A food dryer built to specifications of Extension Bulletin EC 855 will be used, and some commercial dryers will be shown. Bulletins and instruction sheets on drying goods, making fruit leathers, dehydrators and other information concerning all phases of drying will be available free of charge to those attending.

Everyone is invited to attend the free workshop. Other workshops will be held in Milton Freewater, Pendleton, and Hermiston. Identical information will be presented by Mrs. Saul at each workshop.

Citizens of rural Oregon can expect improved public transportation services soon if a ten-project \$936,000 federal grant application materializes.

Rural residents in Umatilla and Morrow counties would benefit from a dial-a-bus type service designed to provide commuter transportation services to an increasing number of industries in the Boardman area. A request for \$377,936 in federal funds to be matched by \$297,663 in local funds has been made to operate the experimental program for two years.
