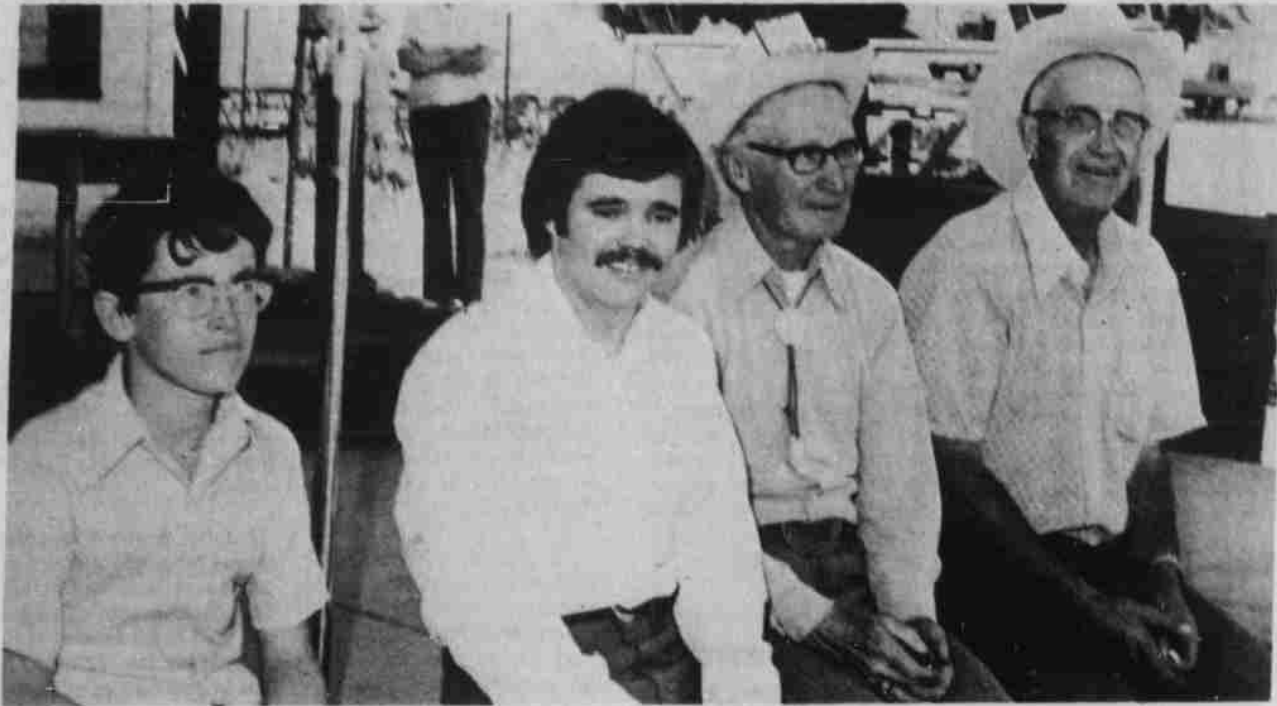
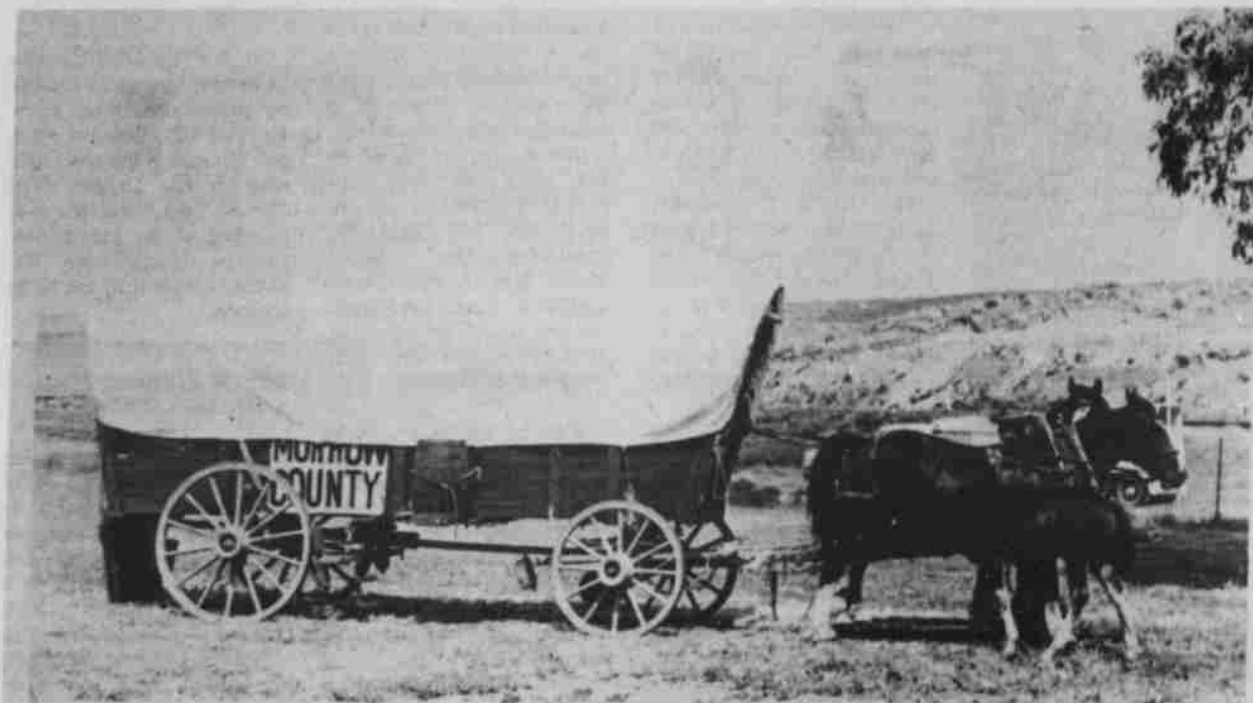




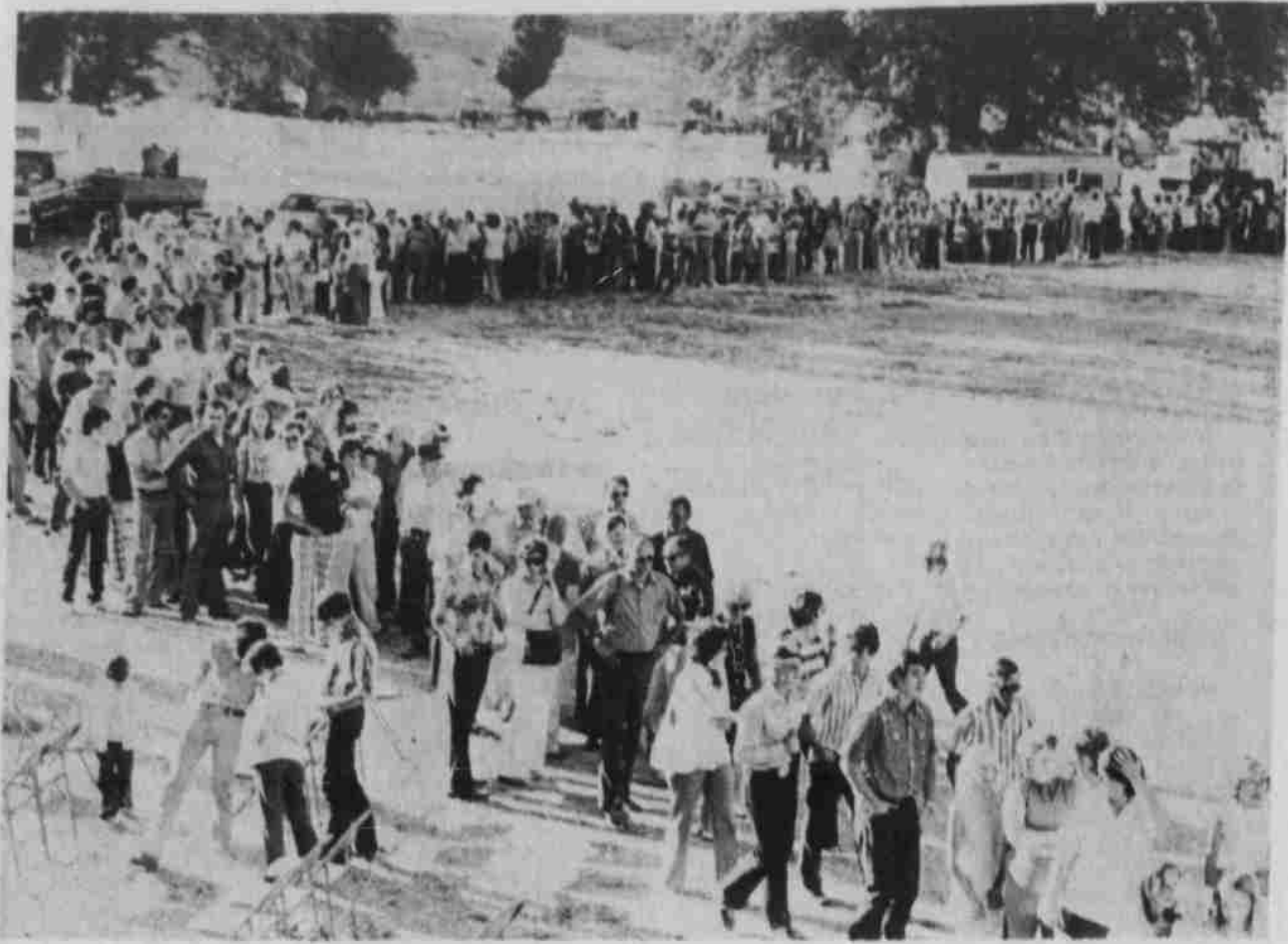
This covered wagon representing the State of Oregon will travel to Pennsylvania. This is one of the 15 covered wagons currently making the journey.
