Recording star to appear here

LaWanda Lindsey, teenage recording star, will perform at the Rodeo Court Dance at the fair pavilion, Aug. 9. She is one of few 14-year-old girls who signed a major contract and went on to become a performing star.

She was born in Savannah, GA., and has been part of the music scene since she was 5 years old. She performed as a singer with her father's band, the Dixie Showboys. She credits her parents with her start in music. "They traveled with me a great deal and always encouraged me."

She signed with Chart Records, Nashville, when she was 14 and recorded 21 singles and 4 albums, including a duet album rendition of "Wild Mountain Berries" with Kenny Vernon. She has since moved to Bakersfield, CA, and has signed with OMAC Artist and records for Capitol Records.

LaWanda has had numerous television shows to her credit including the Bill Anderson Show, the Wilburn Brothers Show, Music Country U.S.A. and has made numerous appearances on Hee Haw. She has appeared on Grand Old Opry and the Wheeling Jamboree.

She is a busy entertainer and spends 10 months a year touring the country in personal appearances. She is also a budding songwriter. One of her compositions, "Wave Bye Bye to the Man," was recorded by Lynn Anderson.

As for her plans for the future she intends "to continue in country music as long as I'm able, because I love it."

William C. Heath, 65, died Saturday, July 26 at St. Anthony's Hospital, Pendleton. Heath was born in Ford County, Kansas, Dec. 17, 1909 and was a resident of Heppner for the past 30 years.

Funeral services were held Tuesday, July 29 at 1 p.m. from the First Christian Church, with the Rev. Edwin Sikes officiating. Military graveside services were held at the Heppner Masonic Cemetery conducted by the American Legion.
