## 34,000 lose their wheels

More than 34,000 Oregonians lost their driving privileges during the first six months of 1975, an 11 per cent increase over the comparable period of 1974.

The Motor Vehicles Division reported Monday that 34,624 persons had their driver's licenses suspended for vary-

ing periods of time during the first half of the year, compared with 31,012 license suspensions during the first six months of last year.

Mandatory suspensions following conviction for driving under the influence of alcohol climbed 20 per cent, from 6,404

in the first half of 1974 to 7,714 in 1975.

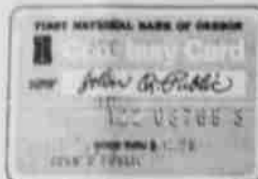
