Free clinic for school children

Pre-school and pre-high school students will have the opportunity to receive free health examinations and immunizations in Morrow County again this year with clinics scheduled for Heppner, Aug. 26 and Irrigon Aug. 27.

Sponsoring the free clinics will be Extension Service, in cooperation with county and health departments. Doctors Gifford and Carpenter will donate their services to assist with the program in Heppner, with Doctors Ortiz and Flaiz of the Hermiston Medical Center staffing the Irrigon Clinic.

Parents are reminded that appointments are necessary for their children.

Call Heppner 676-9911 for appointments for the Aug. 26 clinic; call 922-3321 for Aug. 27. Call soon as only a certain number of children can be screened each day.

All health examination and forms required for school entry will be available at the clinic. Those needing only immunizations may receive them at the clinic on a drop basis, with no appointment needed. For further information call Pat Wright, county health nurse, Mike Tolar, Principal, A.C. School records confidential

Since the passage of the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, school districts have turned their attention towards compliance with this act.

Morrow County Schools have developed a policy for the handling of student records which assures that the confidentiality of the student record is protected.

All student records maintained by the district schools may be inspected by any parent or legal guardian of any student who is enrolled.

If these records are behavioral records, however, a qualified person who is capable of interpreting the record must be present. In Morrow County Schools this qualified person is the school counselor or school principal.

Release of records for court proceedings, either civil or criminal, are made only by the Superintendent of Schools or by the parents or guardians of the student.

In cases where a student is over 18 years of age, they may authorize this release themselves.

Progress records, but not behavioral records are available to all teachers, parents and agencies having a demonstrated interest in the students welfare.

All premium slips (open class, 4-H and FFA) should be turned into the main fair office no later than Tuesday noon. An exhibitor cannot be paid premiums unless the premium slip is returned to the office.

This system is being tried this year to insure more accuracy especially in getting the correct name and address and to streamline the workload in the fair office. The fair management is expressing their appreciation in advance to the exhibiting public for their cooperation this year.

Four empty spaces remain for community booths at the Morrow County Fair. Any community organization wishing to have a booth is asked to call Liz Curtis, 676-9454. The Fair Committee urges that no booth space be left empty.
