PUBLIC NOTICE

In accordance with recent legislation, nearly all properties in Morrow County, (outside incorporated towns), which are now taxed at the farm deferral rate, have been zoned "Qualified Farm."
The requirement for a \$500 income the previous 2 out of 3 years has been removed. Some properties not previously eligible for the farm deferral taxation rate may now be.

Properties may retain farm deferral taxation without being zoned "Qualified Farm", but re-application for farm deferral has to be made before March 31 each year.
Properties which have farm deferral AND are zoned "Qualified Farm" do not have to re-apply for farm deferral each year, and are also eligible to pay inheritance taxes on the farm deferral value of the farm, rather than fair market value.

Lands zoned "Qualified Farm" MUST receive farm deferral taxation. The minimum lot size in a Qualified Farm Zone which may be used for purposes other than farming is 20 acres. The minimum lot size which may be used for purposes other than farming in a "Farm" Zone is 5 acres.

County-city receive funds

The Oregon Transportation Commission today approved 19 requests for proposed Off-System Road projects on rural roads and streets. Total estimated cost of the projects is \$3,104,800 of which \$2,421,744 will be paid by the federal government and \$683,056 by local agencies. There is no cost to the state.

The program was announced last May as a means designed to improve rural area roads. Only those roads which are not part of the federal-aid system are eligible for financial assistance under the program.

Under the funding program, the federal government pays 78 percent of the cost and the local unit 22 percent with no state funds involved. Oregon received an allocation of \$4,678,615 as its share of the program and when matched by local funds it will amount to \$5,998,224 for repair to local roads and streets.

The projects requested by local agencies include for Morrow County and Heppner the following:

MORROW COUNTY: install automatic signals and drop arm gates, and improve and widen the crossing at the Union Pacific Railroad Crossing (Patterson Ferry Road) signals. The estimated cost of the project is \$50,000.

CITY OF HEPPNER: grade, drain, base and structure, Willow Creek (Morgan Street-Heppner) Bridge section. The estimated cost of this project is \$100,000.
