## IRRIGON NEWS

The August City Council meeting in Irrigon centered mainly on the business of a proposed Water Improvement District to serve the southwest area of the City where a 24 lot subdivision is being laid out. The subdivision was previously approved and the proposed improvement district would bring water service to approximately 20 acres of new lands. A hearing was set for Sept. 9.

The city water system improvements which have been under construction are now completed and the council met at the pumping plant before the regular meeting to inspect the facility. A 200,000 gallon reservoir was added increasing storage capacity to 220,000. A 15 horse power booster pump was added as well as a LP gas driven 1,000 gpm pump for fire fighting and emergency standby in case of power failure. A pump house and well house were built to house the plants and a cyclone fence was extended to enclose the tanks and pump houses.

A request to rent a mobile home on property not owned by occupant was turned down. It was noted that an ordinance change would be necessary. The council unanimously expressed the opinion that rescinding this provision would open the door to conditions that would create problems, especially in the press of a housing shortage.
