Hermiston

BASIC SPOKEN SPANISH—Beginning Spanish taught in the speaking-listening method. Emphasis on pronunciation and simple sentences. The course will provide opportunities for practical conversation on everyday topics, current events and cultural materials.

COMMUNICATION SKILLS—This course is designed to improve the student's writing skills so that he can communicate more effectively with others. Concentration is one of the processes of expository writing.

WELDING—The course introduces set-up and operation of oxyacetylene welding equipment. Demonstration and practice in welding, brazing, and soldering ferrous and non-ferrous metals. Preregistration necessary. (Mail tuition to BMCC)

BOOKKEEPING—An introduction to accounting for beginners as well as a refresher for persons who have had some training and/or experience; an introduction to payroll accounting.

OIL PAINTING—Introduction in the use of oil color and other painting media.

BASIC PHOTOGRAPHY—The course is for the beginning and amateur student of photography. Theory and laboratory procedures will be combined to develop a working knowledge of the basic principles and fundamentals of general photography.

EXPECTANT PARENTS CLASS—A one term course designed for both parents. The course will include anatomy and physiology of conception, pregnancy, the birth process, as well as the concomitant emotional changes and adjustments that occur. Infant growth and development as well as baby care through the first year will also be covered.

NURSE AIDE CLASS—The class will consist of approximately 40 hours of classroom instruction designed to provide sufficient background to the student to discharge the duties of a nursing aide. While the course will not include any actual work experience in facilities, students who complete the course will receive on the job training at the facility which employs them.

SEWING WITH KNITS—A basic course to utilize and understand knit and stretch fabrics. Garments constructed may include pullovers and blouses, pants, skirts and vests which will be used to demonstrate techniques such as stretch necks, zippers, waistbands, sleeves, hems, trims, and finishes.

BUSINESS MATH—A study of employee compensation, fractions and decimal fractions, percentage, financial statement analysis, buying goods, selling goods, and simple interest and discount.

Margaret Davis will serve as the coordinator in the Hermiston area. Margaret has lived in Hermiston since 1964 and is a member of the Hermiston Planning Commission.
