

Pirates sink Mustangs

The Riverside Pirates continued on their unbeaten win streak as they defeated the Heppner Mustangs 19-6, Boardman, Friday.

The Mustangs won the toss of the coin and elected to receive the ball. A long kick by Robert Richards into the end zone prevented a run back by

the Mustangs and the ball was brought out to the 20 yard line. On the first play of the game the ball was fumbled and the Pirates recovered the ball on the Mustangs 27 yard line. A double reverse, executed perfectly by the Pirates as Arlie Hamilton ran 27 yards and scored the Pirates first touch-

down of the game with only 51 seconds of playing time elapsed in the first quarter.

The try for the extra point hit the upright and the ball bounced back on the field and the Pirates led 6-0.

Midway through the second period Pirate Steve Doherty intercepted a Mustang pass
