Oregonians to honor Wayne Morse

Oregon's tribute to Wayne Morse, the Wayne Morse Banquet, will be held at Portland's Memorial Coliseum, Saturday, Nov. 15, 7:30 p.m.

Friends of Wayne Morse and friends of the Democratic party from all parts of the state are expected to attend.

Among those in attendance will be Tom McCall, Governor Bob Straub; U.S. Congressmen Jim Weaver, Les Aucoin, Bob Duncan and Al Iullman; Labor Commissioner Bill Stevenson; State Treasurer Jim Redden, numerous state legislators and other elected officials; labor leaders; and state and local party leaders. A cocktail reception at 6:30 p.m. in the Georgia-Pacific

room of the Coliseum will precede the banquet.

The program includes an address by U.S. Sen. Birch Bayh. Other Democrats seeking the Presidential nomination will be represented. According to Franklin Lamb, chairman of the Oregon Wayne Morse Banquet Committee, telegrams from Hubert Humphrey and Ted Kennedy have been received and will be read to the guests.

Restoring trade with North South Vietnam

Legislation will be introduced in the Senate to lift current trade restrictions with the governments of North and South Vietnam. Sen. Mark Hatfield, sponsor of the proposal, said this step should begin a dialogue leading to information about the 1300 MIAs and POWs still unaccounted for in Indochina.

Past congressional attempts to secure information about the MIAs have been directed through intermediary countries, or through sanctions, and Hatfield said direct contact with the Vietnamese government is needed. He said "release last week of American missionaries by the North Vietnamese indicates the governments of Vietnam are

willing to discuss settlement of differences and to begin the process of normalization of relations."

"We have avoided helping the citizens of a war-torn land to rebuild their lives," Hatfield said. "We have not followed the course we chose at the conclusion of World War II, a course of reconciliation, compassion, and assistance to both enemy and ally alike."

"Instead we have followed a blind policy of retribution and neglect which has undermined efforts to seek an accounting of our men, which has denied the historic charity of Americans to those whose lives have been shattered by war, and which has served no useful or constructive purpose."
