#### Hermiston

**JEWELRY MAKING:** Introduction into handworking nonferrous metals. Includes hand construction and centrifugal casting. [Preregistration]

**TOILE PAINTING:** Students must have completed beginning toile painting. Will do advanced projects including flowers, animals and simple scenes. Individualized help on own projects. Be prepared to paint the first class.

**BASIC FARM WIRING:** Fundamentals of electrical wiring. Reference to code book and its applications to dwellings and farm use.

**MACRAME:** Introduction to basic macrame knots and demonstrating the combination into designs. Several projects will be completed during this five-week course.

**INCOME TAX PREPARATION:** A basic tax education program for new tax return preparers or a refresher course to help you become more proficient in preparing Federal Income Tax Returns. [6-wk class]

**BEGINNING TYPING:** Designed to meet the particular practice needs of each student, this course provides a variety of drills for keyboard reinforcement, technique development, and basic skill development. A series of Skill Probes helps students determine what specific drills they should practice. [6-wk class]

**EXPECTANT PARENTS CLASS:** A one-term course designed for both parents. The course will include anatomy and physiology of conception, pregnancy, the birth process, as well as the concomitant emotional changes and adjustments that occur. Infant growth and development as well as baby care through the first year will also be covered.

**CHILD DEVELOPMENT:** A number of child growth and development theories will be explored to allow parents to apply the concepts to such practical situations as will be described. Some stress upon remedial programs will be made. Modifying behavior through the use of reinforcement techniques will be a primary approach to the class.

**CAKE DECORATING:** Students will learn basic skills in decorating cakes for all occasions. Icing and sugar work in borders, flowers, letters and other shapes will be stressed.

**ACCOUNTING PROCEDURES:** A continuation of the Accounting Procedures begun Fall quarter.

**WELDING:** The course introduces set-up and operation of oxyacetylene welding equipment. Demonstration and practice in welding, brazing, and soldering ferrous and non-ferrous metals. [Preregistration]

**PHOTOGRAPHY:** This course is for the beginning and amateur student of photography. Theory and laboratory procedures will be combined to develop a working knowledge of the basic principles and fundamentals of general photography.

**FIGURE CONTROL FOR WOMEN:** This course is a personal improvement and body conditioning program for women. Students will learn to exercise properly to get their body in good physical condition as well as to maintain it after the conclusion of the class.

**BASIC ELECT. CODE:** Fundamentals of electrical wiring. Reference to code book and its applications to dwellings and farm use.

**TECHNICAL REPORT WRITING:** A course in the methods of technical research, evaluation of data, and the organization of that data into a useful written report.

**SCIENCE SEMINAR [HS Students]:** A seminar series designed by the science faculties of Hermiston High School and Blue Mountain Community College and open to all high school students in Hermiston, Umatilla, Riverside, Stanfield, Echo. Topics will include the following: Astronomy, Desert Biology, Wildflowers of Eastern Oregon, Geology, Atomic Energy, and Electromagnetic Waves. The class will also include an all day field trip to Hanford and an evening trip to the Whitman College Planetarium.

**INTERMEDIATE SPOKEN SPANISH:** A continuation of Basic Spoken Spanish taught in the speaking-listening method. Emphasis on pronunciation and simple sentences with additional material to add to knowledge and skill learned in the basic class. [5-wk course]

**AUTO TIPS FOR WOMEN:** Designed to meet the needs of female drivers with special emphasis upon diagnosing fundamental roadside emergencies; orientation to various automotive systems, warning signals, safe servicing with basic tools and non-technical repairs.

**FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT FOR SMALL BUSINESS:** A practical course in fundamentals for operating a small business. This course is designed to be easily understood and of immediate practical value. The course will cover the analysis of your own business, breakeven charts, building and forecasting sales, borrowing money, reducing the costs, inventory control, simple economics, and management by objectives.

#### Heppner-Lexington

**PHYSICAL FITNESS FOR WOMEN:** This course will include physical exercises and conditioning as well as various activities which can be used during leisure time - volleyball, tennis and badminton.

**TYPING:** Beginning typing or typing review. This course may serve as an introduction to typing as well as a refresher for persons who have had some training or experience.

**INCOME TAX:** This course is designed as a practical course on income tax for the average taxpayer. It provides an overview of the various rules and regulations of the Internal Revenue Service affecting the average taxpayer. It affords the student the opportunity to understand and accurately prepare a tax return for both federal and state taxes.

**CALLIGRAPHY:** Fundamentals of lettering and design with emphasis on essential techniques and use of tools. Extra cost for supplies.

**PHOTOGRAPHIC PROJECTS WORKSHOP:** Beginning or review class designed to involve students in functional projects utilizing photography and/or photographic process. Students will work in designing and producing their own postcards, personal books and calendars. Extra costs for supplies and lab fee. No photographic experience necessary. Preregistration.

**ADVANCED-BEGINNERS TOILE PAINTING:** A continuation of Beginning Toile Painting; must have completed Beginning Toile Painting or have painting experience. Course will include advanced elements, antiquing, and finishing. Preregistration.

**PRIVATE PILOT GROUND SCHOOL:** The class will cover the principles of flight, meteorology, navigation, aircraft and engine operation, flight instruments, flight information publications, radio communications, and flight problems. Students completing the class should have sufficient knowledge to pass the Federal Aviation Administration written examination for the Private Pilot Certificate.
