Oregon death toll

Oregon's 1975 traffic death toll stood at 565 as the year ended, the Motor Vehicles Division reported Thursday.

It was the lowest traffic toll the state has recorded since 1963, when 563 were killed, and 16 per cent below the toll in 1974.

Deaths may be revised upward later if persons now listed as injured die as a result of those injuries or if delayed death reports are received, a division spokesman said.

Tentative figures indicate that 439 people died as passengers or drivers of motor vehicles. Eighty pedestrians, nine bicyclists and 37 motorcyclists were listed as traffic victims for the year.

There was only a very slight reduction last year in pedestrian deaths and about a 13 per cent drop in motor vehicle

occupant deaths, but the bicycle deaths were cut in half and motorcycle fatalities dropped 43 per cent from 1974.

Preliminary figures indicate that multiple death crashes decreased last year with only 47 crashes listed as killing two or more people. In 1974, there were 58 multiple death crashes.

Weekends accounted for nearly half of traffic fatalities with 47 per cent occurring between 6 p.m. on Fridays and midnight on Sundays or during extended holiday periods.

Although total accident and injury figures will not be available until about March, the division spokesman said figures for the first 10 months indicate increases in both total accidents and injuries, despite the lowered death toll.
