### TEACHERS ATTEND O.M.E.C. WORKSHOP

The Oregon Mathematics Education Council is sponsoring a series of workshops for teachers from Morrow, Gilliam and Wheeler Counties. The six session series began in December with a workshop devoted to the metrics system and measurement lead by Mr. Don Fineran, Oregon Department of Education mathematics specialist.

The workshop in January emphasized mathematics concept building through games and activities. This session was lead by Carl Deikhans and Allan Claudson, instructors from Treasure Valley Community College and Eastern Oregon State College.

Further sessions were lead by Mrs. Dorothy Rogers, elementary mathematics coordinator for the Newberg Public Schools and Mrs. Eve Boyd, resource center teacher for the North Clackamas School District. Teachers gained ideas and made materials for improving their mathematics classes.

The next workshop will be in Condon at the elementary school Saturday, April 10. Linda Campbell an elementary teacher from Gresham, will present a workshop on instructional strategies for using manipulative materials for teaching problem solving in elementary classrooms.

Electronic hearing tests will be given by the Beltone Hearing Aid Service office at the Northwestern Motel, Friday, April 2, 2-6 p.m.

Factory trained hearing specialists will be at the Northwestern Motel, Heppner, to perform the tests.

Anyone who has trouble hearing or understanding is welcome to have a test using the latest electronic equipment to determine if his loss is one which can be helped. Some of the causes of hearing loss will be explained and diagrams of how the ear works will be shown.

Everyone should have a hearing test at least once a year if there is any trouble at all hearing clearly. Even people now wearing a hearing aid or those who have been told nothing could be done for them should have a hearing test and find out whether the latest methods of hearing correction can help them hear better.

Come to the Heppner Elementary School's multi-purpose room next Tuesday evening, April 6, 8 p.m. and learn about your county's history from some experts.

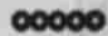
The Heppner Branch of the American Association of University Women plans a public, community-service program each year. This year it is the Historical Swap on the date of the branch's usual April meeting.
