Mr. and Mrs. Steven Kendall and Allen went to Portland Tuesday for medical attention.

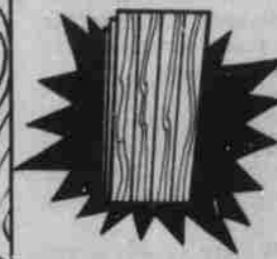
