# Heppner Tracksters Qualify for State

The Heppner girls track team qualified 6 girls and the boys qualified 5 members to the State Class A track and field meet at Lewis and Clark

College, Portland, May 21-22. The boys finished in a tie for second and the girls finished third at the District 7-A meet held at Condon last weekend.

Team scoring for the boys were Sherman County 110, Heppner and Weston-McEwen 63, Wasco County 57, Umatilla 55, Pilot Rock 43½, Helix 37, Condon 35, Riverside 29½, Echo 18 and Ione 3.

Team scoring for the girls were Sherman 110, Wasco County 66, Heppner 66, Pilot Rock 60, Echo 57, Weston McEwen 15, Ione and Umatilla 13 and Riverside 0.

The Heppner girls earned three blue ribbons as Diane Holland set a school record in the javelin with a toss of 11'3". Maureen Healy won the 440 with a time of 1:0.5 and the relay team of Kimee Hague-wood, Lori Harrison, Debbie Cox and Healy was first with a time of 1:58.9.

Molly Pierce qualified for state running second in the 880 with a time of 2:45.9. Healy was also second in the 220 with :26.1 and Holland was second in the shot put with a distance of 31'2-¾".

Other winners for Heppner were Healy, fourth in the high jump at 4'10"; Tami Toll, sixth, in the long jump with 15'6"; the 440 relay team of Toll, Cox, Harrison and Hague-wood finished fourth in the hurdles at :16.7 and second in the 220 with :27.8.

Wade Padberg earned second spot in the 220 and the 440 to earn a trip to Portland. His :32.2 in the 220 was his best time ever. He was :53.3 in the 440. The 440 relay team of Marlin, McLaughlin and Piper qualified with :47.4 and second place. Dan Marshall's 122'4" toss in the discus for second place puts him in the state meet.

There were several other personal best by the boys. Marlin bettered his own school record in the triple jump by three inches and placed third with 40'8". Marty Smith threw 46'10½" in the shot put and placed third and earned fifth in the discus with a toss of 112'2". Greg Clow also placed in the discus with a 109'5" and sixth place. Marshall's 41' 2½" toss in the shot earned fourth.

Piper jumped 5'10" in the high jump for a third and the mile relay team of Marlin, McLaughlin, Piper and Padberg were third in 3:46.8.

District 7 is the north east part of the state and this year only seven schools competed from this area. B schools A, AA and AAA all competed against one another. A team is comprised of five girls with the four best scores of each round added together for a team total.

This year's tourney was 36 holes, 18 played Monday and 18 played Tuesday. The best two teams qualified for the state tournament to be held at Glendover Golf Course, Portland, May 17-18.

Final team totals for the tourney are as follows: Redmond 761 strokes, Heppner 868 and Wahtonka 937 strokes.
