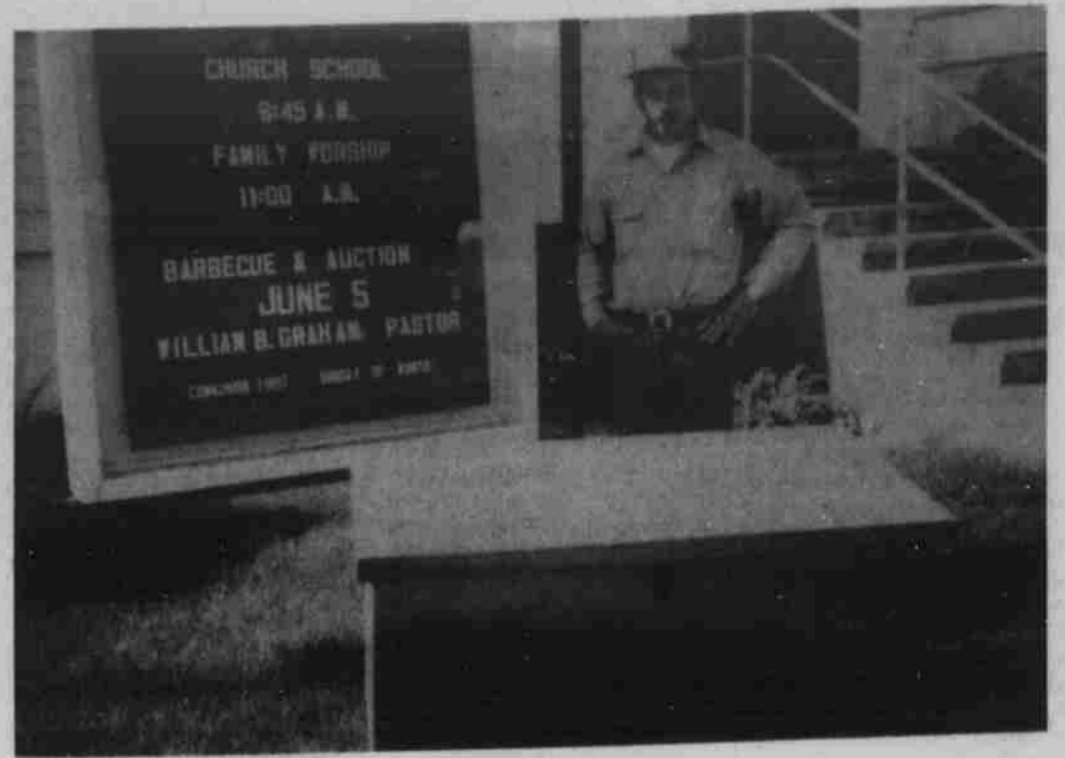
# \$4,000 donated
