Notice is hereby given that a special election of the City of Heppner, Oregon will be held in such city and state on the 14th day of June, 1976, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. PST, at the following voting place:

HEPPNER, MORROW COUNTY, OREGON**

At this time there will be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Heppner, the question of establishing a tax levy for the fiscal year 1976-77 for the sum of \$32,138.00 as submitted by Section 2, Article 11, of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, which fiscal period commences July 1, 1976, and ends June 30, 1977. Said levy shall be placed upon the 1976-77 assessment rolls and the taxes will be due and payable on November 15, 1976, February 15, 1977, May 15, 1977 and August 15, 1977. The reasons for establishing this levy are for the payment of increases in equipment and supplies, in employees' salaries, social security, workmen's compensation, contracted services and materials necessary for the operation and maintenance of the City of Heppner, all as required by the laws of the state of Oregon, plus the loss of Federal Revenue Sharing money.

The votes will be by ballot upon which will be marked (Yes, I vote for the tax levy) and (No, I vote against the tax levy), and the voters shall cross the () with an "X" by the words (Yes, I vote for the tax levy) or by the words (No, I vote against the tax levy), which ever indicates his choice.

All voters will vote at the Heppner City Hall, Heppner, Oregon. By the order of the Common Council of the City of Heppner.

TAX LEVY OUTSIDE THE CONSTITUTIONAL LIMITATIONS

Monday, June 14, 1976, Polls open 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
To be held at Heppner City Hall

The voter shall place an (X) or check mark (✓) in the voting square before the word YES or the word NO, whichever indicates his choice.

PROPOSAL

Shall the City of Heppner, Oregon be authorized to levy for the fiscal year 1976-77, the sum of \$32,138.00 outside the 6% limitation set forth in Section 2, Article 11 of the Oregon Constitution.

EXPLANATION OF BALLOT QUESTION

Without the approval of the voters, the City of Heppner has authority to levy only the tax base of the City, which is \$39,137.00. This sum, together with available non-tax revenues, is not adequate to meet the operating needs of the City.

Because the tax base is inadequate, it is necessary to submit to the voters for the fiscal year 1976-77, a tax levy request in excess of the tax base. If approved, the operating budget to be financed by local taxes for the years 1976-77 will be \$32,138.00 greater than for the preceding year. This constitutes a rate of levy increase over the preceding year in the maximum amount of \$2.77 per thousand of true cash value of taxable property.

The reasons for increasing the levy are: Loss of Federal Revenue Sharing money, plus increases in cost of equipment and supplies, contracted services and materials, employment salaries, social security, workmen's compensation, all necessary for the operation and maintenance of the City of Heppner.

NOTICE OF SALE OF SURPLUS SCHOOL LAND

Notice is hereby given that the District School Board of School District Number 1, Morrow County, Oregon, has declared the following described property not to be required for school purposes, and will sell the same at public auction on June 5, 1976, at the hour of 10:00 a.m. on the site of the land, the land being described as follows, to-wit:

All that portion of the land described in the deed from Elaine S. George to the Morrow County School District recorded in Book 64, Page 85, Morrow County, Oregon, Deed Records lying North of the following described line to-wit:

Commencing at the Northeast Corner of Lot 1 Adams Addition to the City of Heppner; thence East along the South right-of-way line of Aiken Street extended a distance of 130 feet to a point on the East side of that tract of land conveyed to Maynard Struthers as recorded in Volume 65 on page 295, Morrow County Deed Records, the point of beginning of this description, thence East 35 feet to a point; thence South 68.85 feet to the beginning of the line above mentioned; thence East 212.5 feet more or less to the West boundary of that land conveyed to Morrow County as recorded in Volume 51 Page 284, Morrow County Deed Records, thus describing the South boundary of the land to be conveyed all in the City of Heppner, Morrow County, Oregon.

The District School Board has set a minimum price of \$3,500.00 for the purchase of the property, and the property will be sold to the highest bidder but the School District reserves the right to reject any or all bids. Unless all bids are rejected, the property will be sold to the bidder complying with the terms of the Notice of Sale, and submitting the bid which provides the highest return to the School District. The sale shall be for cash, must be unconditional and may be made by a certified check or a cashier's check in favor of the District, or upon a bank doing business in the State of Oregon, or in cash. The District shall convey the land by a good and sufficient deed, signed by the proper officers of the District and subject to the resolution adopted by the Board at its regular meeting, May 17, 1976, when the land was declared by the Board not to be required for school purposes.

**KINZUA SAFETY
CONTEST**

The first three month period of the Kinzua Corporation-Eastern Oregon Logging Co. Safety Contest ended April 30, 1976.

Employees of Kinzua and Eastern Oregon Logging are placed on safety teams, and are kept mainly within their respective departments where possible.

Points are assessed against each team, when a member of that team has a recordable occupational injury or illness or lost time through an on-the-job accident. Also points are assessed for each work day lost through an accident. Winning teams are determined by those teams having zero points or the lowest number of points accumulated during the first three month period of the contest and at the end of every odd month thereafter until the contest ends on April 1977.
