Work on two separate facilities in north Morrow County should be completed by November, according to Matt Doherty, superintendent of Morrow County schools.

The facilities are a four classroom addition at Riverside High School in Boardman and an eight class room addition at A.C. Houghton elementary in Irrigon.

Smith-Hasigawa of Ontario is the architect and Riverman and Sons of Portland is the contractor.

School district meeting July 19

The Morrow County School District Board will hold their regular monthly meeting July 19, at 9 p.m. at Ione High School.

Prior to the regular meeting the board and budget committee will meet at 8 p.m. to consider whether or not to use some carryover money saved from the past years; budget and come unexpected receipts from basic school support to restore essential items that had been cut from the building program.

Cuts had been made because building bids had exceeded the amount of money made available by the bond issue. In regular business, the board will consider a job description for teachers, contracts for teaching staff and hiring of classified personnel.

Bids will be considered for bulk gasoline, diesel, anti-freeze, fuel oil, bus service, one contract bus run, and windows at Heppner Elementary.

The board will consider a request to purchase a temporary easement for placing dirt from a sewer excavation on school property in Boardman.

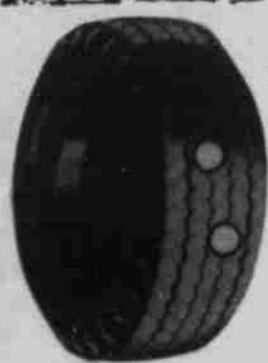
The South Morrow County Ministerial Association met to conduct their monthly business meeting and elect officers.

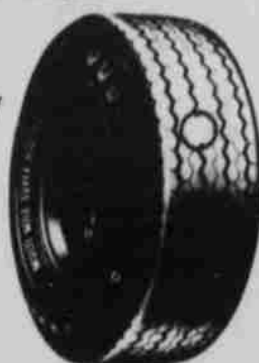

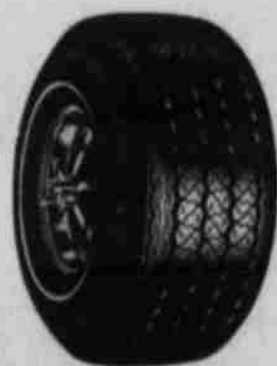
