unds. Miss Robinson took two grand champion honors, two championships, one reserve

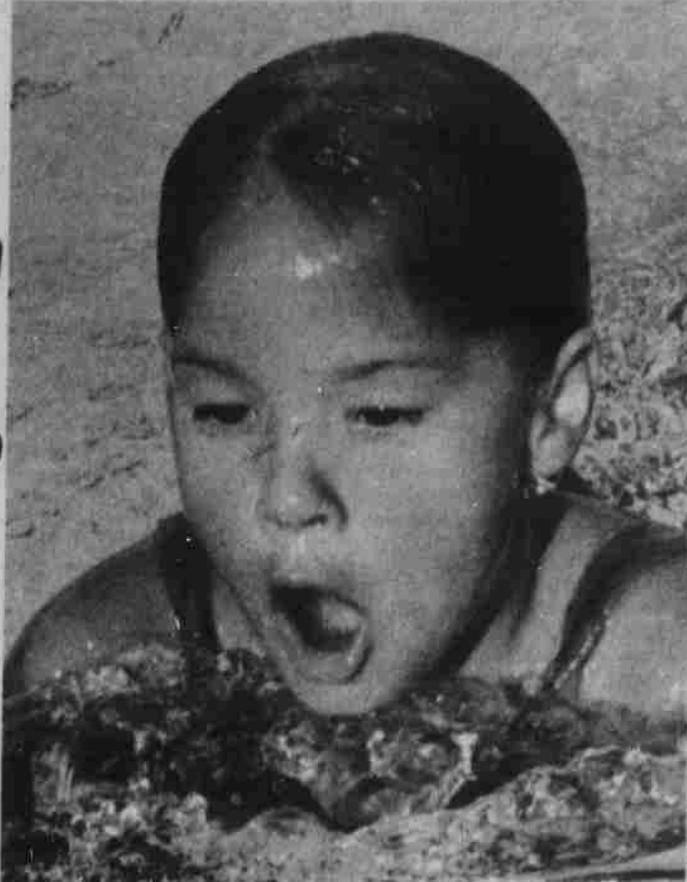
