Plenty of reserve buckaroo seats left

Plenty of seats are still available in the reserve section of the north grandstand at the Morrow County Fair and Rodeo Grounds.

The seats, which cost \$5 a seat per show, are waiting to be sat in during the three Rodeo Cowboy Association shows. The shows will run on Saturday afternoon and night and Sunday afternoon.

Ray Boyce, ticket sales chairman, says there are at least 200 seats still available. They will be on sale during the parade Saturday morning at Boyce's insurance office on Main Street.

The seats in the north grandstand are in rows, A through H. The first three rows are already taken by contestant's wives. So, row A will start at the fourth row and go up eight more rows. There are an average of about 33

seats per row.
