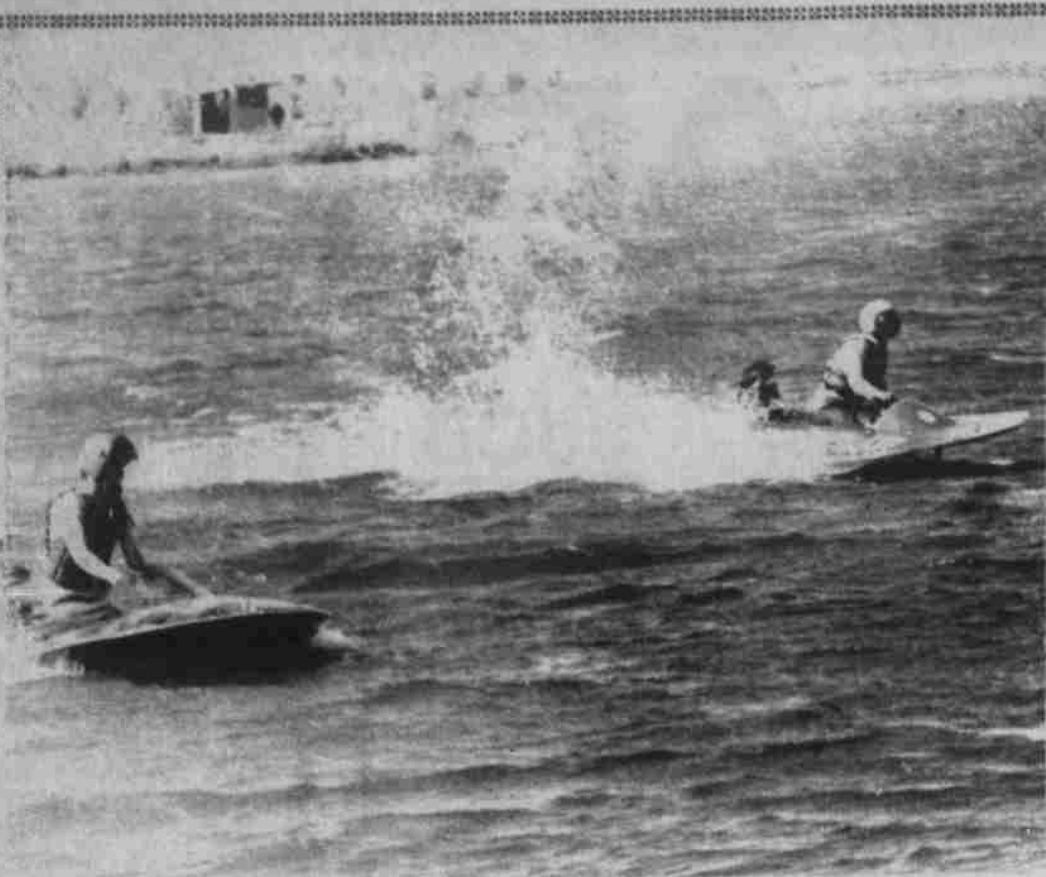




Harvest festival success again

Renew by mail for license

If your car license expires at the end of September, the Motor Vehicles Division still wants you to renew by mail if at all possible.

Car license renewal by mail will help shorten lines in DMV field offices, and help those drivers who must renew in person to be issued a photo

license. Since more than half of the 50,000 drivers who renew licenses each month are renewing in person, field offices are extremely busy all the time.

Car owners who renew by mail should have their new registration and stickers in

about a week.

If you cannot renew by mail, a DMV spokesman urges you to renew in mid-month rather than the last week or first week of the month. Lines are longest during the last few days or first few working days of the month.

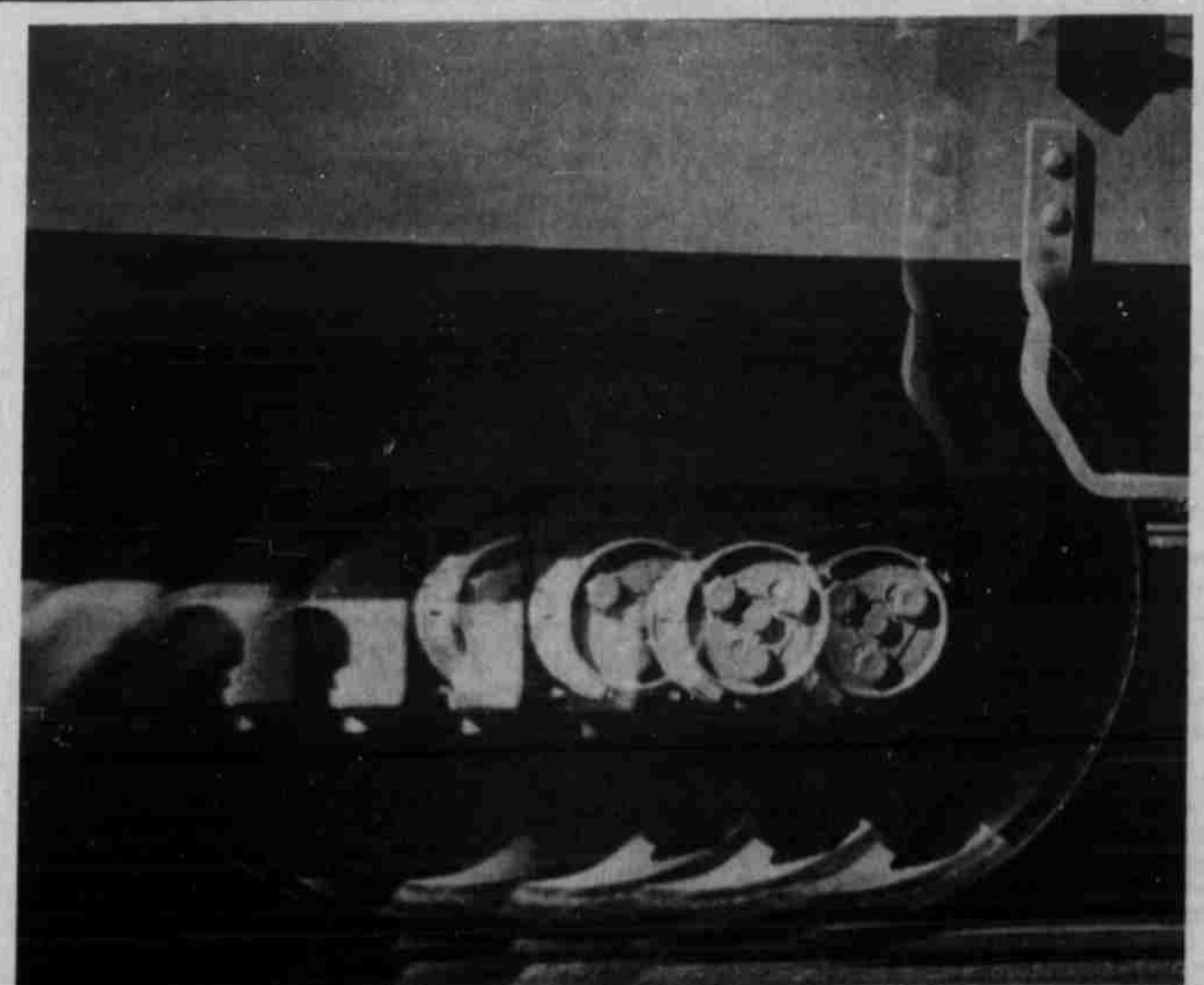
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
