

4-H changes to grade membership

Starting this fall, membership criteria for 4-H will change from year born to grade in school, according to Birdine Tullis, Extension Service. The decision for the change was made by the Oregon 4-H Advisory Committee early this spring.

Young people entering the fourth grade will be eligible for membership now, rather than the former requirement of nine years of age. Included in the change is the termination of 4-H membership after grade twelve. Young people finishing high school will still be able to participate in the

county fair, state fair, Pacific International and National 4-H Congress following their final year in high school.

No great change is expected from the switch to grades, and actually the divisions of junior, intermediate and senior will be simpler to comprehend when they are stated as 4th, 5th and 6th grades, 7th, 8th and 9th, or 10th, 11th and 12th, Birdine said.

All young people entering the fourth grade, and older are encouraged to contact Mike Howell or Birdine Tullis at the Extension Office, for membership in a 4-H club.

HERMISTON

INTRODUCTION TO FILM (Film Series starts Sept. 28-Tues. 7-10p.m. Instructor: Soderstrom, Tuition \$15. Hermiston Jr. High. The purpose of the course is to develop visual literacy. Feature films will be viewed weekly and discussed in terms of aesthetics, society, history and directors.

COMMUNICATION SKILLS: Starts Sept. 28-Tues. 7-10p.m. Instructor: Smith, Tuition \$15. Senior High School. This course is designed to improve the student's writing skills so that he can communicate more effectively with others. Concentration is one of the processes of expository writing.

HISTORY OF WORLD WAR II: Starts Sept. 29-Wed. 7-10p.m. Instructor: Thomason, Tuition \$15. Senior High School. The course will involve a re-examination of the origins, conduct, and consequences of the World War, 1939-1945. Moving from a study of the inter-war years and the dynamics of Nazism, the course will progress through the major campaigns (with an emphasis on the European theater) using recent studies of strategy, diplomacy and leadership as they bear on the outcome of the war and development of post-war societies. Students may take the course for credit or audit.

ANTHROPOLOGY: Starts Sept. 30-Thurs. 7-10p.m. Instructor: Hilden, Tuition \$15. Senior High School. Physical Anthropology—Principles of and types of evidence for evolution, fossil man, biological and cultural evolution, races in man.

MACRAME: Starts Sept. 27-Mon. 7-9p.m. Instructor: Cullers, Tuition \$5. Rocky Hts. School. Introduction to basic macrame knots and demonstrating the combination into designs. Several projects will be completed during this five-week course.

BASIC CAKE DECORATING: Starts Sept. 28-Tues. 7-10p.m. Instructor: Green, Tuition \$15. Senior High Multi-Purpose room. Students will learn basic skills in decorating cakes for all occasions. Icing and sugar work in borders, flowers, letters and other shapes will be stressed.

WELDING: Starts Sept. 27-Mon. 7-10p.m. Instructor: Davis, Tuition \$15 + \$20 lab fee. High School Shop. The course introduces set-up and operation of equipment and any welding equipment. Demonstrations and practice in oxyacetylene, cutting, brazing, welding; as well as, fuel, vertical up and overhead down arc welding.

SKETCHING-DRAWING: Starts Sept. 29-Wed. 7-10p.m. Instructor: Campbell, Tuition \$15. High School Art Room. Sketching in multi-media—figures drawing, still life, contemporary free form using pen, ink, charcoal, crayon.

EXPECTANT PARENTS CLASS: Starts Oct. 4-Mon. 7-10p.m. Instructor: Ford, Tuition \$20 couple. Good Shepherd Hospital. This is an eight-week course designed for the expectant couple. This course covers preparation for the parents-to-be, what to expect at the hospital, and care of the new mother and the newborn. Breathing techniques and relaxation exercises (Lamaze birth techniques) are emphasized to prepare the couple for a controlled labor and delivery.

BASIC PHOTOGRAPHY: Starts Sept. 29-Wed. 7-10p.m. Instructor: Halling, Tuition \$15. Junior High School. This course is for the beginning and amateur student of photography. Theory and laboratory procedures will be combined to develop a working knowledge of the basic principles and fundamentals of general photography.

PRIVATE PILOT GROUND SCHOOL: Starts Oct. 4-Mon. & Thurs. 7-10p.m. Instructor: O'Rourke, Tuition \$25. Junior High Library. The class will cover the principles of flight, meteorology, navigation, aircraft and engine operation, flight instruments, flight information, radio communications, and flight problems. Students completing the class should have sufficient knowledge to pass the Federal Aviation Administration written examination for the Private Pilot Certificate.

BASIC ELECTRICAL CODE: Starts Sept. 27-Mon. 7-10p.m. Instructor: Miller, Tuition \$15. Junior High School. Fundamentals of electrical wiring. References to code book and its practical applications to dwelling and farm use. Will cover code changes and revisions.

BEGINNING TYPING: Starts Sept. 27-Mon. & Wed. 7-9:30p.m. Instructor: Porter, Tuition \$15. Senior High School. Designed to meet the particular practice needs of each student, this course provides a variety of drills for keyboard reinforcement, technique development, and basic skill development. A series of skill probes help students determine what specific drills they should practice. (Five-week class)

ACCOUNTING PROCEDURES: Starts Sept. 28-Tues. 7-9:30p.m. Instructor: Jenkins, Tuition \$15. Senior High School. An introduction to accounting for beginners as well as a refresher for persons who have had some training and/or experience; an introduction to payroll accounting. (Two-quarter sequence)

INTERMEDIATE SPOKEN SPANISH: Starts Sept. 29-Wed. 7:30-9:30p.m. Instructor: Willoughby, Tuition \$10. Junior High School. A continuation of Basic Spoken Spanish taught in the speaking listening method. Emphasis on pronunciation and simple sentences with additional material to add to knowledge and skill learned in the basic class.

ADVANCED TOLE PAINTING: Starts Sept. 28-Tues. 7-10p.m. Instructor: Smith, Tuition \$15. Senior High School Art Room. Class will cover advanced painting techniques including wood grains, stencils and individual projects. Students should have had two terms of painting. Come to first class session prepared to paint.

BEGINNING GUITAR: Starts Sept. 30-Thurs. 7-9p.m. Instructor: Weimer, Tuition \$10. Junior High Music Room. Learning to play single guitar solo by reading music notation for guitar.

BASIC MATHEMATICS: Starts Sept. 27-Mon. 7-10p.m. Instructor: Harmon, Tuition \$15. Junior High School. The course is designed for the student who needs a thorough review of basic arithmetical processes.

INTERIOR DESIGN: Starts Sept. 28-Tues. 7-10p.m. Instructor: Conklin, Tuition \$15. Junior High Art Room. Basic principles of interior design will be covered to help class members learn to plan the decoration of their own homes. Analysis and discussion of sample and actual situations will be a major portion of the course. Field trips will be included.

CREATIVE STITCHERY ON CLOTHING: Starts Sept. 28-Wed. 7-9p.m. Instructor: Fries, Tuition \$5. Junior High School. Course will cover basic embroidery stitches. Individual projects developing stitchery patterns for clothing including shirts, scarves, and jackets. Various methods of transferring patterns to fabric will be discussed.

TENNIS: Starts Sept. 28-Sat. 9-11a.m. Instructor: Bagnall, Tuition \$10. High School. A five-week course for adults with beginning to intermediate tennis skills.

WOODWORKING: Starts Sept. 29-Wed. 7-10p.m. Instructor: Howard, Tuition \$15 + \$8 lab fee. Oregon Trail High School. Students will be taught the use of hand and power tools along with methods of assembly and finishing. Students will construct projects of their choice within limits of ability as determined by their instructor.

BASIC ACCOUNTING: Starts Sept. 27-Mon. 7-10p.m. Instructor: Struckmeier, Riverside High School. An introduction to accounting for beginners as well as a refresher for persons who have had some training and/or experience in introductory to payroll accounting.

HEPPNER-LEXINGTON-IONE

GOLF: Starts Sept. 25-Sat. 9:30-11:30a.m. Instructor: Edmundson, Tuition \$10 + \$5 green fees for non-members, Willow Creek Country Club. A five-week course for adults with limited prior golf experience.

PHARMACOLOGY REVIEW II: Starts Sept. 27-Mon. 7-10p.m. Tuition \$15. Instructor: Kendrick, Heppner High School, Room 18. Continuation of Pharmacology Review I. Topics to be covered: Histamine and Antihistamine, Cough and Cold preparations, Gastrointestinal Drugs, Circulatory Drugs, Diuretics, Hormones and Steroids, Anesthetics, sedative and tranquilizers released in last year, and Fluorouracil.

BASIC SPOKEN SPANISH II: Starts Sept. 28-Tues. 8-10p.m. Tuition \$10. Instructor: Peck, Lexington School. Basic expression and conversation taught through dialogues. Some beginning grammar and reading. Prerequisite: Basic Spoken Spanish I or teacher approval.

BEGINNING TOLE PAINTING: Starts Oct. 5-Tues. 7-10p.m. Tuition \$15. Instructor: Piper/Padberg, Lexington School. Designed to teach the student the basic elements of tole and decorative painting. Work is done from patterns with application to a great variety of home decorations. Student does not need any background in drawing or sketching.

FURNITURE REPAIR AND REFINISHING: Starts Sept. 29-Wed. 7-10p.m. Tuition \$15. Instructor: Peterson, Ione High School. Study of woods and steps of furniture repair and refinishing. Students work on own item of furniture.

WELDING: Starts Sept. 28-Wed. 7-10p.m. Tuition \$15 + \$20 lab fee. Instructor: Weatherford, Heppner Junior High Shop. Instruction in arc welding and the fundamentals of oxyacetylene. Demonstrations and practice in welding, brazing, and soldering ferrous and non-ferrous metals.

TENNIS: Starts Sept. 30-Thurs. 9-11a.m. Tuition \$10. Instructor: M. Doherty, Ione High School. A five-week course for adults with beginning to intermediate tennis skills.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT FOR SMALL BUSINESS: Starts Sept. 30-Thurs. 7-10p.m. Tuition \$15. Instructor: Wilcox, Heppner High School, Room 1. A practical course in fundamentals for operating a small business. This course is designed to be easily understood and of immediate practical value. The course will cover the analysis of your own business, break-even charts, building and forecasting sales, improving inventory, reducing the costs, inventory control, simple contracts, and management by objectives.
