The girls are easily identified by their Mustang honoring colors of blue and gold.

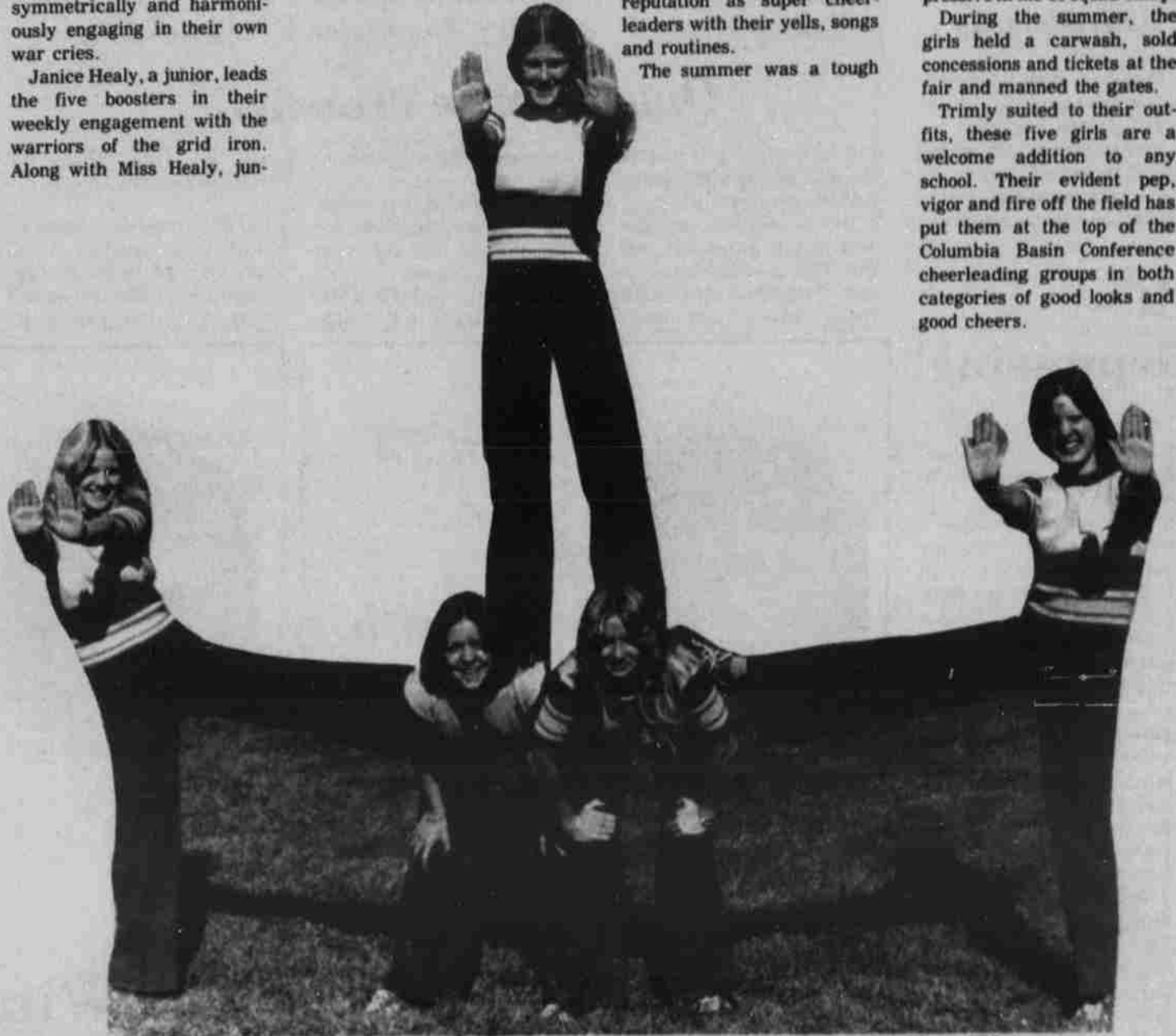
