Several new families have moved into the apartment house. They are Mr. and Mrs. John Belknap and family, and Mr. and Mrs. Bob Clark and family.

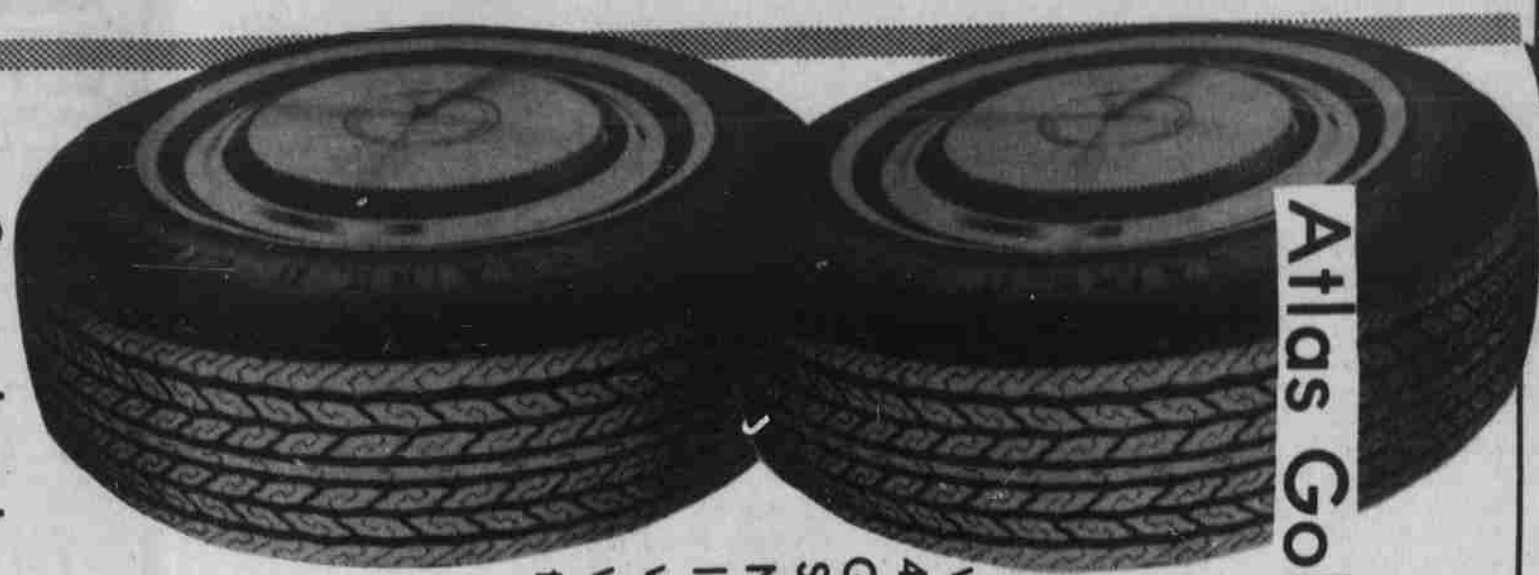

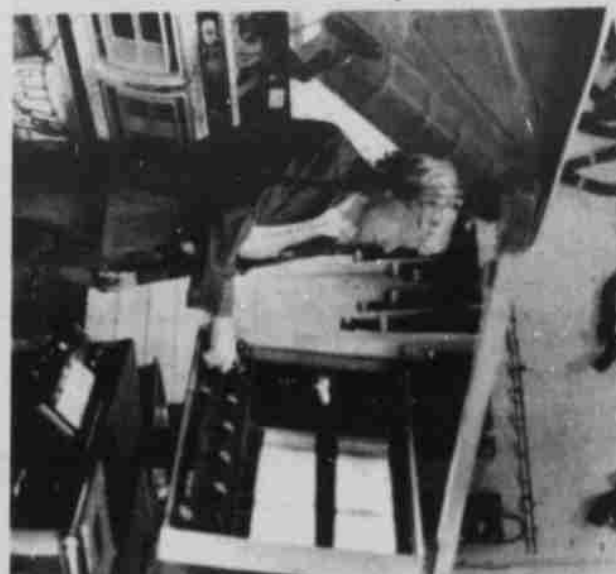
