The band was the first group to perform, playing a John Phillip Sousa tune to start the evening and finishing strongly with highlights of "Exodus." Midway through the performance, Ackley handed over his baton to student director, Bill Kenny. Kenny commandeered the group through two selections from Deep River Suite.

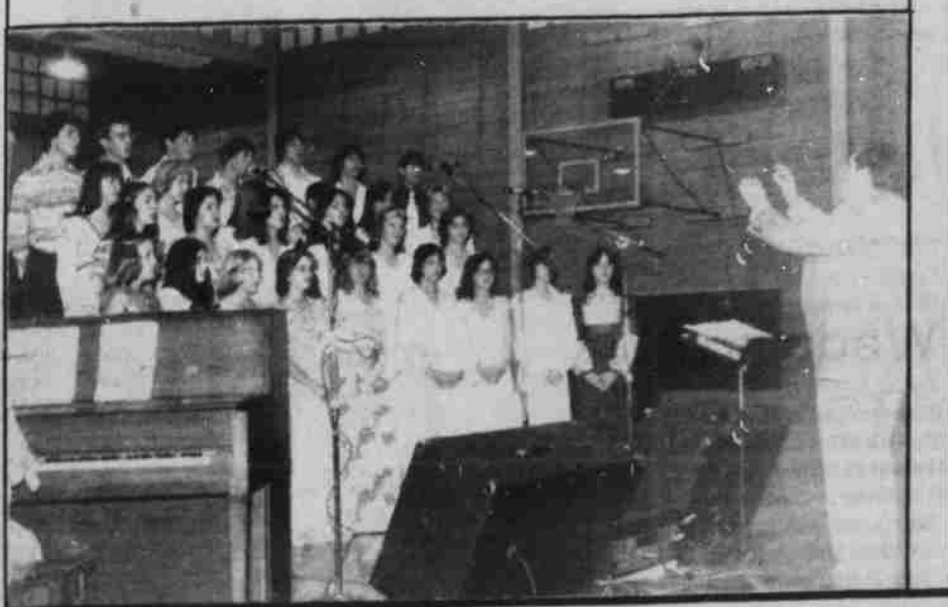

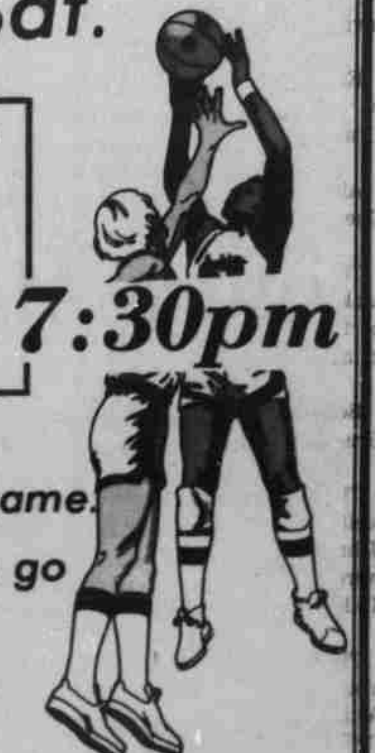
