Tree permits required

Christmas Tree Permits are required for each tree cut on National Forest land. Permits are \$1 per permit per family. Permits may be obtained from all Ranger's Offices and the Supervisor's Office in Pendleton during regular working hours (7:45 a.m.-4:30 p.m.) Monday through Friday, and on Saturdays, Dec. 4, 11, and 18, and at Pendleton from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. The Pendleton Office is located at 2517 S.W. Hailey Avenue.

Instructions and other information will be given to you when you obtain your permit.

Here in Morrow County, persons wishing to cut a tree on National Forest land need to obtain a permit from the

Heppner District U.S. Forest Service office up on High School hill. They will be issued weekdays from 7:45-11:45 and from 12:30-4:30 and on Saturday, Dec. 11, between 8:00 and 1:00. The charge is \$1 per tree.

back. If we had had an ambulance then I know the boy who died might have lived."

The EMTs hope to take an EMT II course which would involve further training. "If such a course comes around within driving distance," says Skoubo, "then we'll sure take it." There is a county van available for more extensive rescue-type use but it lacks equipment other than some oxygen tanks, resuscitators and a few hammers.

"Eventually," said Skoubo, "we hope to have enough equipment to do a better job."

Since an ambulance driver may be required to carry a first aid card, three firemen will be taking a multi-media first aid course Dec. 2 and 9 at Riverside High School. Though the ambulance service is completely separate from the fire department, it will be housed in the same building. Two firemen have already taken the EMT course and three more are taking it this year.

Many of the resident EMTs are employed by Gourmet Foods. Others include a high school teacher, a deputy, two registered nurses and Skoubo's wife Carolyn and daughter Linda.

"I'm sure glad it's coming," Skoubo said. "Especially living on this highway like this. We really have needed it for years."

Heppner gains new Christmas street lighting

Heppner will be graced with Christmas lights of a different color this year. The Heppner-Morrow County Chamber of Commerce has purchased new street decorations and a tall Spruce will be placed on the corner of Main and Court Streets.

The decorations were purchased from The Dalles. They have had three years of use and have been stored for another three. Cost for each scroll-type-candle-lit decoration is \$30.

Compared to a new decoration that costs between \$175 and \$200, Randall Peterson, merchants' chairman, told the chamber they were getting a buy.

The chamber will purchase the lights and will be reimbursed by the merchants

committee later. Total cost of the project is about \$1,000.

The new lights will be on every light pole starting at the bridge on Main and lining both sides of the street to Court Street Market.

The lights will be six and a half by five and a half feet wide. The lights resemble a candle, scroll and wreath, according to Peterson.

The lights will be installed by Columbia Basin Electric Cooperative and the Heppner city crews.

A large Spruce tree that is being cut down near Heppner soon, won't go to waste. It will be standing tall near the old Ford Garage building on Main Street. The tree will be decorated and will set off the street, but in plain view from Court Street and Main.
