Corrections

The Heppner Gazette-Times lists two corrections from stories in last week's paper.

In another story concerning antirecessionary checks, the GT reported that Lexington and Ione had not received their checks because they had not applied. Card coach wants steady improvement

"We're looking for steady improvement. If we get that, well, that's all we can ask," said Martha Doherty, Ione Cardinal head girls basketball coach.

Doherty heads into the pre-season with a roster of 16 girls. She hasn't selected a varsity yet and won't till today. Her Cardinal girls face Mt. Vernon Saturday at 4:30 there.

The girls will work out of a 1-3-1 offense and man-to-man defense, with a switch to a zone when necessary.

Doherty said she would rely on aggressiveness since the Cards have little height or speed. "Aggression," she said, "we'll have to fight for everything we can get."

Doherty coached two years ago at Ione and holds a

master's degree in physical education.

She will field a 12 girl varsity with a couple girls going both ways on varsity and JV.

"They've never worked harder than right now," Doherty said, watching the Cardinal girls run through fundamental drills. "If that's any indication, we should be alright."

The 16 girls include seniors: Donna Palmer, Joan Doherty, Dawn Peterson, Debora Palmer. The juniors are Grace McElligott, Susan Thompson, and Carol McElligott. The sophomores are Janet McElligott, Lisa Martin, Darcy Rea, Robin Leavitt, Arletta Aldrich and Michelle McElligott. Freshmen are Martha McElligott and Lori Edwards.
