The contest judges surely had a struggle in naming the winners for the evening. Marsha Mathewson, one of the judges, announced the winning efforts. The other two judges were Susan Dicker and Anne Toney.

The winning play was "Not Enough Rope," which was stage-managed by Carl Christman. The runner-up was "The Monkey's Paw," Bob Miller was the stage manager for this three-scene production.
