

# Hermiston outscores Fillys by 15 for 2nd half triumph

A poor second half and "rookie refs" are to blame for Heppner's loss to Hermiston last week in girls' basketball action, according to Coach Rebecca Randall. The Bulldog females rattled Heppner with a convincing, 48-28 pounding. Lisa Kunkel and Karin Sobotta combined for 32 points, both hitting 16 to lead Hermiston. Kunkel also yanked down 22 rebounds in the contest.

Hermiston outrebounded Heppner, 36-32, despite a good effort from Maureen Healy, who continues to lead the conference in rebounds with a 14 carom average.

The Fillys dropped back 11-7 after one period and trailed by five at halftime. But a strong second half propelled
