

Rockettes win, face St. Paul

Terry Connor, a first team all CBC guard, will lead Pilot Rock girls this week in the state class "A" girls' basketball tourney in Pendleton.

Pilot Rock, who finished fourth last year in the tourney, will have to contend with pre-tourney favorite, St. Paul, in their first bout, set for 7:30 p.m. Thursday. Knappa, another favorite along with St. Paul and Pilot Rock, faces Regis in a Thursday afternoon tilt.

The Rocket girls crowned Weston-McEwen, 44-37, after holding off Tiger Scot rallies

all through the game. Connor led PR with 16 points, aiding the Rockettes to an 11-3 first period edge and an 18-10 half-time lead.

In preliminary district action last week, PR bounced Sherman 50-31, behind Connor's 16 points. The Rockettes exploded for a 29-9 halftime lead and coasted home for the win.

Weston-McEwen finished with a burst in the last three minutes Thursday to hold off Wasco County, 39-32. Liz Cahill had 19 for WM and Kelly Lindell had 14 for Wasco.

Cards end season at 1-20

Ione's Cardinals finished their season last week with a pair of losses. The Cards' season record ended at 1-20.

Their lone win was a 59-57 win over Umapine. Other close contests included a 30-29 loss to Ukiah; a 71-68 loss to Umapine; and a 49-45 loss to Condon.

Lopsided scores went with the close ones. Ione was blasted 67-30 and 88-47 by Helix; 76-29 and 75-34 by Arlington; and 60-18 by Riverside.

Slides will be shown on the Hell's Half Acre area and some areas of heavy winter range usage by elk and deer.

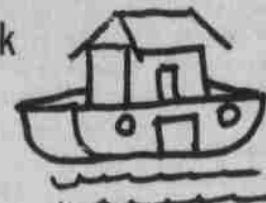
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
