Without the approval of the voters, the City of Heppner has authority to levy only the tax base of the City, which is \$41,485.00. This sum, together with available non-tax

revenues, is not adequate to meet the operating needs of the City.

Because the tax base is inadequate, it is necessary to submit to the voters for the fiscal year 1977-78, a tax levy request in excess of the tax base. If approved, the operating budget to be financed by local taxes for the years 1977-78 will be \$46,445.00 outside the 6 per cent limitation of the Oregon Constitution. This constitutes a rate levy increase over the preceding year in the maximum amount of \$3.52 per thousand of true cash value of taxable property. Last year the rate of levy was \$2.77 per thousand of true cash value.

The reasons for increasing the levy are: Reduction of Federal Revenue Sharing money, plus increases in cost of equipment and supplies, contracted services and materials, employment salaries, social security, workmen's compensation, all necessary for the operation and maintenance of the City of Heppner.
