County voters Tuesday rejected a school operating levy

measure designed to establish a stronger base for school budgets.

The proposed constitutional amendment called a "safety net," was voted down by a 626-341 margin.

Two other measures dealing with the authorization of additional veteran fund uses and the increase of veterans' loan bonding authority both received the county's support.

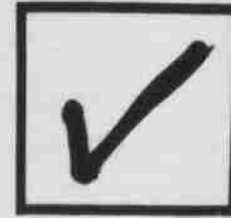
