SEALED written bids will be received by the undersigned until 5:00 p.m. o'clock on the 9th day of June, 1977, at the office of the Port of Morrow, No. 1, Marine Drive, Boardman, Oregon and immediately thereafter publicly opened in the Port Office, for the purchase of Promissory Notes of the Port of Morrow, in the aggregate principal amount of Two Hundred Four Thousand and no 100 (\$204,000.00) Dollars. The proceeds of the Notes will be used to provide interim financing for a portion of the cost of construction and installation of a municipal water system for said Port of Morrow, Morrow County, Oregon. The Notes are to be in the amounts and dated as shown below. Date Issue—June 15, 1977

The Notes shall bear interest at the interest rate bid. Interest and principal shall be payable on or before October 5, 1977. The Port reserves the right to reject any or all bids for the Notes.

The Farmers Home Administration has agreed to purchase on issue of Bonds of the Port of Morrow, Boardman, Oregon in the aggregate principal amount of \$220,000.00, the proceeds of which will be used to retire the Notes herein offered.

Said Notes will be sold for not less than their par value to the bidder offering the lowest effective interest rate to the Port. The bid must contain a statement of the net interest cost, based upon a 360-day year.

The Notes will be issued pursuant to the applicable provisions of Chapter 488, Oregon Laws, 1973 Regular Session. Both principal and interest are payable at the office of the Port of Morrow, Boardman, Oregon.

The Notes will be limited General Obligations of the Port of Morrow.

The Notes will be redeemable at the option of the Port at any time.

A certified or cashier's check or on a Bank doing business in the State of Oregon payable to the order of the Port of Morrow in the amount of two per cent (2 per cent) of the par value of the Notes offered for sale is to accompany the proposal. The Notes will be delivered in Boardman, Oregon, either to the purchaser or a designated agent as soon after the sale as practical or at their issue date. The Port of Morrow will make the award of the Promissory Notes at 5:00 p.m. o'clock on June 9, 1977.

Notice is given hereby that an application has been filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Claude and Anna Graham for approval of a change in place of use and point of diversion from Willow Creek.

The certificate recorded at Page 127, Vol. 1, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Hiram E. Clark, describes a right for the use of not to exceed 0.37 cubic foot per second from Willow Creek for irrigation of 4.0 acres in SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, and 18.0 acres in SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of Sec. 21, T.2S., R.26E., W.M., with dates of priority of 1889 for 0.08 c.f.s. for irrigation of 5.0 acres and 1891 for 0.29 c.f.s. for irrigation of 17.0 acres.
