 rently out of town and have not been contacted.
 "I expect them to accept my resignation," Moon noted. "I have spoken with several of the council members and have not had any indication that they won't."
 Moon will be returning to his previous position as Morrow County planning director.

despite rumors that he would be taking employment elsewhere. He served Morrow County in that capacity for 2½ years before accepting the joint Echo/Irrigon post.
 The position is being funded through a \$10,000 Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA) grant and \$1,500 from each community.

Until council action is taken, officials were unable to comment on the resignation or future of the position.
 Whether this split loyalty position is feasible depends on the person, according to Moon. "It just wasn't for me."

Boardman became the first city in Eastern Oregon to be granted an "acknowledgment of compliance" by the State Land Conservation and Development Commission (LCDC) at its monthly meeting June 14, in St. Helens.
 Boardman originally adopted its comprehensive plan in 1966 when the city was moved to its present location. The old site was flooded by the backwaters of the John Day Dam.
 "This has put us roughly about a year ahead of other cities," stated city administrator Jim Thompson.
 "This makes us about the fourth or fifth city in Oregon to gain compliance," he said, referring to the 14 statewide goals and guidelines established by LCDC. A planning

extension until Oct. 31, 1977, was also granted to the city. This will allow it to complete its comprehensive planning necessary for full compliance with the fourteenth goal of the LCDC requirements.
 That final compliance deals with the city's urban growth boundaries in cooperation with Morrow County. Those boundaries will reach east to Olsen Road, west to Paul Smith Road, north to the Columbia River and south to the West Extension irrigation canal.
 Boardman applied for compliance in January. LCDC postponed its ruling in order to give federal and state agencies an opportunity to comment on the plan. All agencies gave their go-ahead including the Umatilla Wild-

life Refuge after an impact dispute was settled concerning a major housing development and boulevard. The Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) also gave its consent following a storm drain snag.
 What compliance will mean for Boardman, according to Thompson, is fewer problems as far as land use is concerned and growth will be kept under control. This depends on whether the city executes its plan. LCDC will keep the city under observation to see the goals are upheld.

No LCDC money was used by the city to develop its initial plan nor for its 1972 and 1975 updates. Those plans were formulated with city and Department of Housing and Urban Development funds.
 "The fourteenth goal compliance plan will undoubtedly require some LCDC money, however," the Boardman city administrator added.
 The Boardman plan was originally compiled by the Citizens Committee for the Future, later named the Local Citizens Advisory Committee. Seventeen people served on

that group. "We had our local citizens advisory group formed long before LCDC thought of requiring one," Thompson said.
 One of the advantages of having the compliance out of the way is that developments will not be held up in the process of completing a plan.
 "We can proceed much more rapidly with this," Thompson said.
 The proposed comprehensive plan includes the development of pedestrian and bicycle paths.
