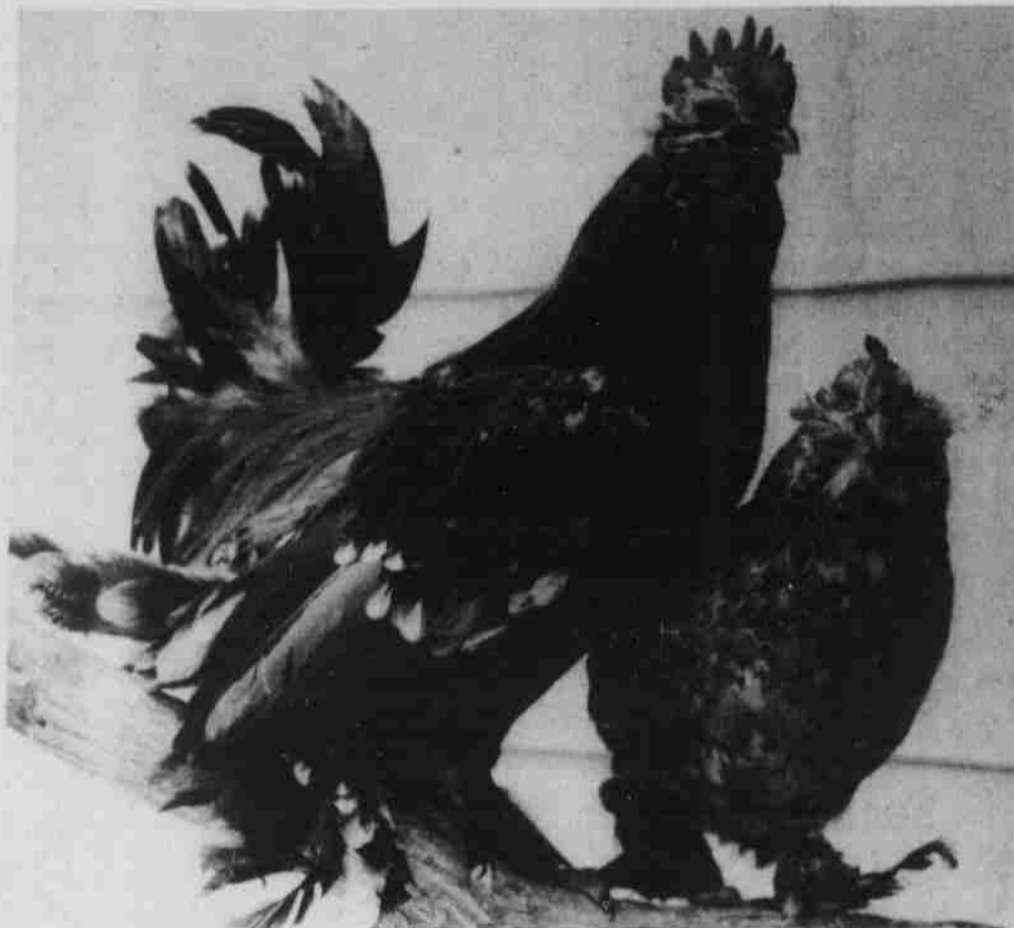


Chinchillas part of Irene Anhorn's animal show
