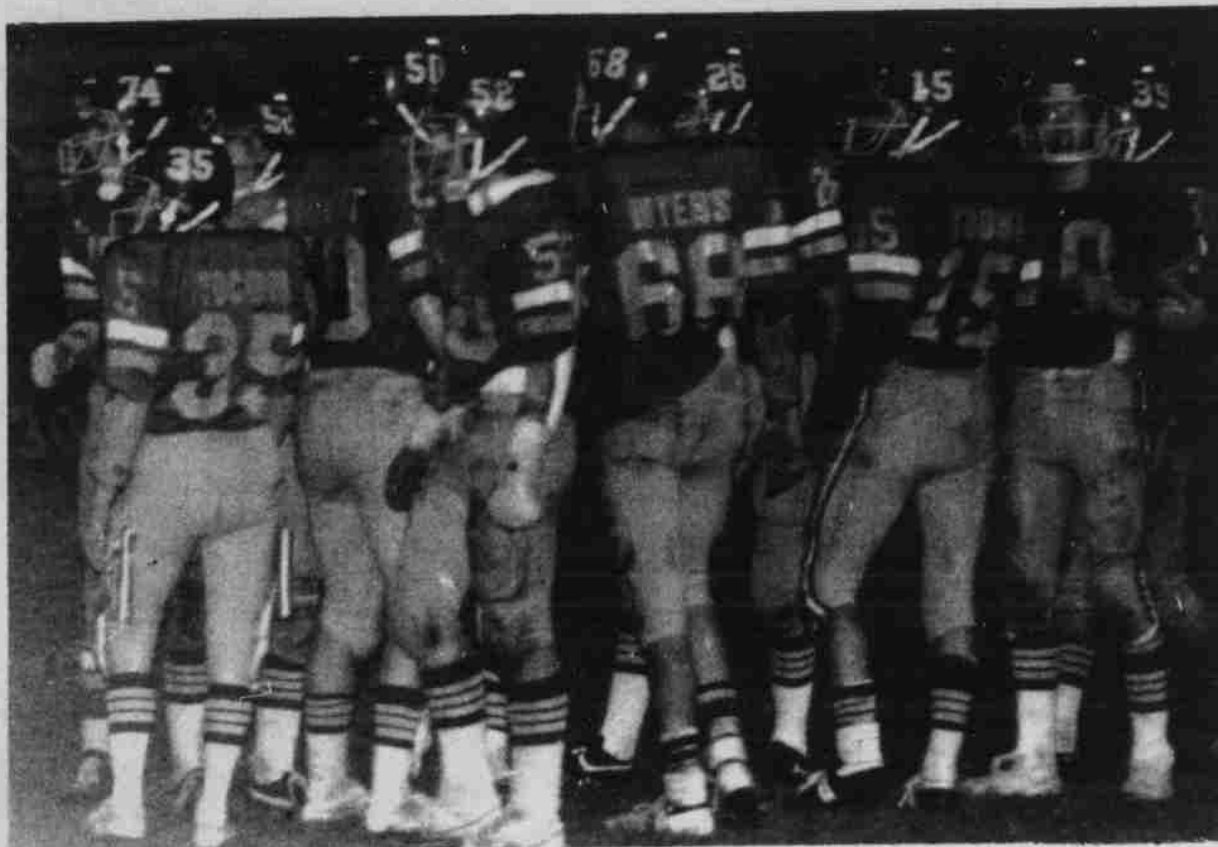


# Lyle Trojans



## Heppner 4 and 2 in CBC race

On the up and down ride that characterizes any high school's football fortunes, the Heppner Mustangs are definitely at an up point—cruising high on an impressive three-game win streak and heading for a Homecoming clash with the Lyle Trojans.

The Mustangs carry a 4-2 mark into the game and have provided their fans with a

Heppner next ventured into Sherman County territory to take on the unbeaten Huskies. Bryce Powell broke loose on a 29-yard TD run and the Mustangs defense turned back several Sherman threats as Heppner took home a hard-earned 7-6 win. Peck went
