They went to Phillips Island off the coast, where they watched the penguins come in at night to their burrows on the beach. This type of Penguin is the smallest of 18 species.

Mr. Jorgensen, being a trucker was fascinated that the trucks in Australia have heavy bars welded on the front to protect them from damage if they should hit one of the larger kangaroo, that are often on the roads of Australia.

On the trip to Australia they stopped over in Honolulu and American Samoa. They lost a day going, when they crossed the International date line but on the return trip they gained it back. Leaving Sydney they flew non-stop to Los Angeles in 15 hours and on to Portland in two hours more. They left Australia at 5 p.m. Saturday

and arrived in Irrigon at 6:15 p.m. Saturday.
