The Morrow County Planning Commission will meet on January 30, 1978 at 7:30 p.m. in the Morrow County Courthouse, Heppner, Oregon, and hold public hearings on the following matters:

1. A variance request by Mary Blettel of Heppner. The variance requested is a change of setback from a side property line to allow construction of a garage. Location of the property is Township 2 South, Range 26 E. W.M., Section 34, Tax Lot 1100. More commonly known as lot 7 of the Wells Addition located on the Spray-Heppner Hwy. south of Heppner.

2. An informational hearing for review and comment on the draft comprehensive plans for the cities of Heppner, Lexington, Ione and Irrigon. Representatives of each city will be present to explain the plans and answer questions.

3. A proposed amendment to the Morrow County Comprehensive Plan. The Amendment would adopt the recently completed Boardman Comprehensive Plan as a portion of the County Comprehensive Plan, including those areas shown as being within the Urban Growth Boundary. Published Jan. 19, 26, 1978
