

# Emphysema self care clinic here Feb. 13-15

Pioneer Memorial Hospital and the Oregon Lung Association will co-sponsor an Emphysema Self Care Patient Workshop next week for interested persons in the Morrow County area.

Patients and their families are invited to participate in the workshop, scheduled for three successive evenings, Feb. 13-15. All sessions will take place in the Heppner

High School Cafeteria from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. Patients are asked to attend all three sessions and should have a member of the family or a close friend accompany them.

Faculty for the workshop is composed of local physicians and para-medical staff. Drs. Wallace Wolff and Richard Carpenter, PMH respiratory therapist Craig Cooley, PMH dietician Evelyn Sweek and a

representative from the Mental Health Clinic will instruct at the Heppner workshop.

There is no charge for the workshop and registration is being handled through the switchboard at Pioneer Memorial. Interested persons should call the hospital at 676-9133 and leave their name, address and phone number. Registration should be completed as soon as possible because space is limited.

Subjects to be covered at the workshop include: structure and function of the lung in health and disease; treatment; use of oxygen; bronchial hygiene; breathing exercises; ostural drainage; and more.

A similar workshop will be repeated in Condon in March.
