An Open Letter To Morrow County Voters

Dear Morrow County Voter:

On Tuesday, Feb. 28, 1978, the voters of Morrow County will vote on a 3-year serial road levy. You will be asked to approve a serial levy in the amount of \$195,000 for a 3-year period. This levy will be used strictly for the improvement, repair and maintenance of Morrow County roads and bridges.

This is not a new levy, nor a new tax. The County has had a serial road levy since 1948. This levy will be for \$195,000, an increase of \$50,000 over the 1973 Levy.

There are three main resources of Road Fund monies:

- 1 - Serial Levy
- 2 - Forest Rentals
- 3 - Motor License Fund

Under the present state law, a percentage of this levy must be returned to the cities of Morrow Co. - The five towns of Irrigon, Boardman, Ione, Lexington and Heppner, which is used for the operation of the cities' street departments.

We now have approximately 378 miles of oiled roads. Added oil costs, freight, repairs, labor, and other items have increased, forcing the county to reduce its annual oiling as the necessity for resealing increases.

The passage of this levy will enable the county to continue its existing program of road improvement, widening, resurfacing, including the sterilization for noxious weed control.

Remember, these roads are our roads. We all travel some part of them. Both city streets and county roads will benefit from this levy. We urge you to vote YES on the levy.

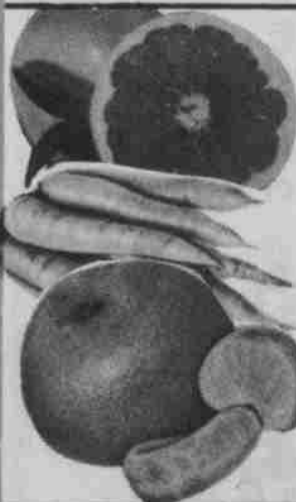
