## Court OKs supplemental budget, map contract

The supplemental budget—\$12,000 of anti-recession funds for courthouse maintenance and museum repair and \$125,000 of general fund money for pivot irrigation tax pay-back—was approved by the Morrow County Court at its

meeting in the courthouse on Wednesday March 8. No one appeared for or against the budget at the advertised public hearing.

In other action the Court signed a \$5,500 contract with Tennyson Engineering Corp.

for the company to provide special planning maps to be used by the county planning office.

Paul Jones and Ardith Hunt, members of the Morrow County Senior Citizens Advisory Committee, and Rollin Reynolds, East Central Oregon Association of Counties (ECOAC) representative, discussed with the Court the new bus soon coming to the county for use by senior citizens and handicapped persons. The bus, equipped with a wheel chair lift, will be given to Morrow County through a federal program which is also supplying buses to neighboring counties. The Court tentatively agreed to allow the senior's citizens' bus to be housed in the county shop when not in use.

## Ione students attend 3-day OSU symposium

Three Ione High School students were among some 80 students from across the state who participated in a Science and Humanities Symposium March 9-11 at the Oregon State University campus.

Grace McElligott, Natalie Tews and Janet McElligott, accompanied by Ione Physics teacher Darrel Wilson, attended the symposium entitled "In Search of Alternative." The event was co-sponsored by OSU and the U.S. Army.

The students sat in on a variety of seminars covering topics such as wind potential in the northwest, science and ethics, organic gardening and dream interpretations. Several student research topics were also presented and the symposium closed with a talent show and banquet.

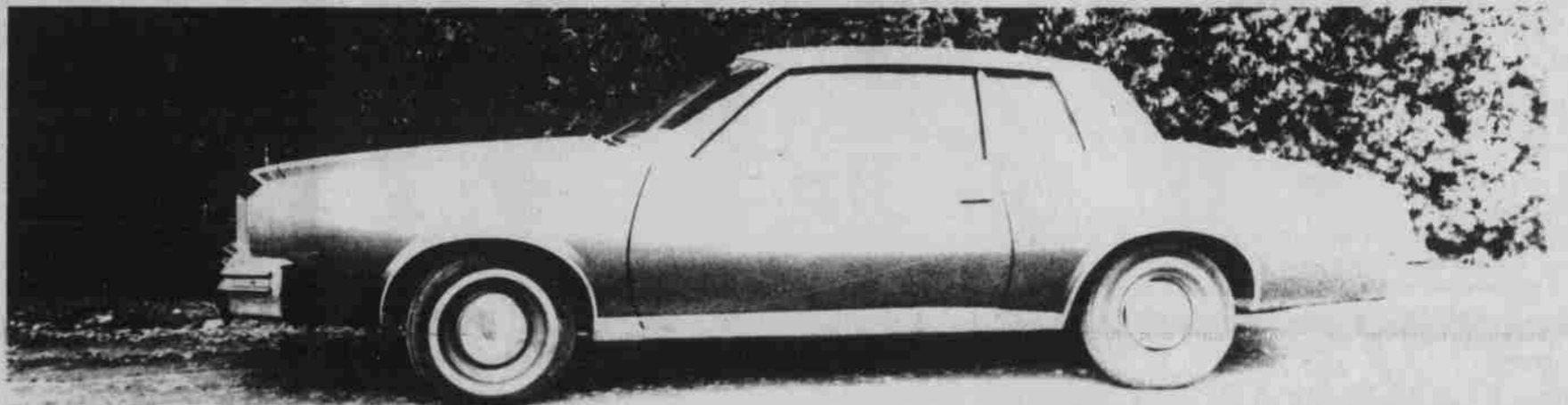
